Contemporary M/M romance with an opposites attract plot between a tattooed pierced baker and a controlling stressed ambitious lawyer. Jeff Morgan's life is his job, luckily he works in the same lawyer's office as his best friend how is getting married in a few days so as the 'manly maid of honor' he goes to the bakery to order a wedding cake for her and meets a sexy (but so not his type) baker, Ollie Cranford. So the chemistry burns hot when they almost immediately start making out in the walk-in fridge so they take it upstairs to Ollie's private rooms. So with some stop and go with Jeff because he just wants it quick and meaningless, but Ollie is over that kind of thing and is looking for a lifetime commitment, but it willing to take it slow with the uptight Jeff.

This all happens in about three days like Shayla Kersten other short stories. This is a fun read but I felt like there was a missing HEA because although the couple is hot for each other there is no promise for the future or even how they will work out their very different lifestyles.

I'm only labeling this an erotic romance because of the HFN that gets tacked onto the end of this novella. For the vast majority of the story, it's just plain erotica. Hot erotica.

Jeff is an uptight businessman who is playing maid of honor for his best friend's whirlwind wedding. She gets called out of town at the last minute and asks him to get the cake sorted out, citing a specific bakery she wants him to use. He goes down and is greeted by the bald, tattooed, biker-type baker, a man that throws his libido into overdrive. It's obvious very quickly that Ollie, the baker, is interested, too, and their flirtation expands into a consensus of sex, at least until Jeff sees the dungeon set-up the man has in his bedroom. Ollie is determined to make Jeff lose control, however, and Jeff, for all his anxiety about doing so, can't seem to walk away.

There's not much more to describe. The men have a lot of sex, with Ollie admitting first to himself and then to Jeff that maybe it's time for him to start think about serious dating again. Jeff is a fly-by-night kind of guy, though, and all the talk about "substantial" freaks him out. Not enough to say no to a second night, though. The novella benefits from the fact that the sex is mostly hot. It reads swiftly, and except for the occasional snort-worthy phrasing (like ...his come rushed to freedom), succeeds at what it intends. If this was sold as straight erotica, it would likely rate higher, because my expectations for characters and the ending wouldn't be quite as stringent. As it is, though, the author clearly strives for the HFN, but can't get there for me, mostly because her two heroes are more archetypes than fully-fleshed characters and little time is spent doing much of anything but having sex.

Uptight businessman Jeff needs to pick out a wedding cake for his best friend. When he gets to the bakery what he picks up is the baker instead. Ollie is to die for sexy, tattooed, pierced, shaved head and with a killer body. Jeff, always the *wham-bam thank you man* type and the sexy baker with a dungeon, who just happens to be looking for a committed relationship, seem like total opposites. Although this is only 48 pages I really enjoyed this story! Okay, I wouldn't mind if it had been twice or three times as long, because that had probably satisfied my curiosity about this deliciously sexy couple. Jeff and Ollie are such interesting characters that I want to know more about them. Together they are incredibly hot. Jeff is a closeted, conservative, big shot business man and Ollie is a bold, tattooed and pierced biker kind of guy who bakes cakes for a living, and is very successful at that. Their attraction is an unlikely one but made very believable and tangible. They do a lot of hot stuff with icing and other food. And they rock each other's world very convincingly!

This is a fun story with some hot, sexy men but a bit of a non-resolution at the end. It only covers a few days so there isn't a happy ending, more of a hope for a happy ending or the possibility of one. However, there's a lot of sex, good tension, and a touch of angst thrown in. I'd recommend this for those looking for some sexy men, delicious uses of icing, and those who like an opposites attract themed encounter.

The story is told in alternating third person point of view and describes the control obsessed Jeff as he encounters a man he's incredibly attracted to but can't quite put a label on, Ollie. Jeff and Ollie meet at Ollie's bakery while Jeff is picking out the wedding cake for his best friend's wedding. Sparks fly and the two spend the next three days having inventive, hot sex while dealing with their issues during internal monologues.

The characters are decently developed and come across as unique, interesting individuals for the most part. Ollie is the most intriguing of the two as a big, rough, tattooed baker with a bedroom filled with kinky sex toys. He's far from a stereotype though and his down to earth, laid back style makes for an entertaining and interesting man. His creativity with icing is just one of his many attractions and his low-key desire for something substantial in a relationship makes for an undemanding, yet attractive detail thrown into the mix.

Jeff is a bit more difficult to engage with his absolute obsessive control freak personality. He seems to freak out over the smallest things and spends a good deal of the story internally angsting over his control issues. Frequently I wanted to slap him over the head as his silent angst would get in the way of a hot sex scene. Also his final "change" at the end seems way too fast and artificial, yet it's one everyone wants to see so I doubt there will be much disappointment.

While Jeff can be somewhat annoying with extended navel grazing about his control issues, the sex scenes here are what caught my attention and kept me reading. Ollie is pretty sexy and his use of food, tension,

buildup, and sex just work incredibly well. In fact I wish there had been more scenes and the story had been lengthened to full length, allowing Jeff to grow more naturally. This isn't a huge compliant and really the story is enjoyable enough to read as it stands. This is not really one I'd read again but it is one I'd recommend based on some great sex scenes and Ollie is a charming character.

And the more laid-back Ollie, who despites his tattoo and his shaved head, is looking for long-term commitment. This is a story about an incredibly uptight career man Jeff, who is the Maid of Honor at his best friend's wedding and in this short story he learns to give up control. Or, more accurately, he is at least open to the idea of giving up control. He grumbles about his Maid of Honor title, but is sincerely flattered and a little clueless as to how to perform his duties. His current task is to order the wedding cake and off he is sent to the bakery owned by Ollie. Oh Ollie, oh my Ollie.
