Spending the holidays in South Cove sounds wonderful if you can look beyond finding a dead body or two. Book three in this series introduces us to Ted Hendricks and a program that matches businesses up with people looking for work. They work as interns as they gain experience to land them a full time job in the future. We quickly learn that Ted is a real creep and had someone not put the people of South Cove out of his misery he would have been headed to jail. It looks like suicide but Jill knows it was murder and is out to prove it.

Cahoon has brought back the characters we loved in the first two books, Jill, Aunt Jackie, town detective/Jill's boyfriend, Greg King, Officer Toby/barista, and more. We meet Marie, the owner of the stained glass shop across the street from Coffee, Books, and More. No one knows much about her past but she and her store are a welcome addition to South Cove. We also deal with Greg's ex-wife, the mayor's wife because she decides to take over planning the holiday festival, both women cause chaos. We also meet all the interns working through the holidays at several businesses.

She has immersed these characters in a story with a bit of romance, the aforementioned chaos, some humor, and plenty of stuff for Jill to poke her nose into so that trouble soon follows.

I loved that the intern working Coffee, Books, and More starts Aunt Jackie's marketing juices flowing and that she comes up with a fabulous way to promote reading for a group of people that are unable to purchase books.

This was a very fast read for me, the title had me thinking I knew who the killer was and I was waiting for a connection to be revealed only the more I read the more I realized I was wrong.

Not only does she have her own bookstore/café to run, but she's asked to be the liaison for a new work program which is run by Ted Hendricks. Each business in the tourist town is assigned an intern to assist them, but the store owners are afraid the interns will turn out to be delinquents and not trustworthy. It's up to Jill to convince them to participate. The big problem is that Hendricks is not a very nice guy. When Jill finds Hendricks dead in his car, she figures that's one less problem to deal with. This story takes place in the relatively small tourist town of South Clove, California. Who doesn't love these quaint small towns, I know I do; especially the small stores which populate towns like this. As I read this book images of the television program "Murder She Wrote" kept popping into my mind. I saw Jill Gardner filling the shoes of crime author Jessica Fletcher; and like Jessica, Jill is involving with books, she sells them instead of writing them.

And like Cabot Cove, Maine where Jessica is the protagonist, there's a lot of intriguing things happening with Jill taking on the role of the protagonist.

Being well-known and liked in South Clove, the mayor finagles Jill into becoming the town's liaison to a new work program to benefit the town's merchants for the holiday season. Jill first has to sell everyone on the plan, because they're fearful that it would mean hiring the undesirables, undesirables who they'd never hired on their own. But, unfortunately, it would also mean having to work with a guy she knows all too well after a few interactions, Ted Hendricks.

However, soon he is found dead in his car, in front of the police office station; and while her hot detective boyfriend thinks it's a suicide, Jill, like Jessica thinks a murder has taken place and sets out to prove it. If this isn't enough, a ritzy blonde wants to sue the city for causing the heel on her shoe to break, interfering with the investigations to find the truth.

And like Jessica in *Murder She Wrote*, Ms Cahoon does a wonderful job in keeping the "surprise" murderer a secret to the end of the book. For this romantic mystery, I must now reveal my feelings for this book, which is 5 STARS.

Unfortunately instead of days being filled with warmth, smiles, and pumpkin pie this little community is too busy trying to find a murderer. Someone has successfully sucked the jolly out of this year's holiday season and even though the person that winds up dead had been a bit of a Grinch himself people are left depressed and a bit shaken. I had already fallen in love with Jill Gardner the owner of a little Book and Coffee shop in a residential tourist town in South Cove in the previous novel. She is your down-to-earth nosy neighbor that can't help but get involved with all the town's mysteries and take charge. This story isn't any different. We get to see Jill meddle in another town murder despite her friends' warnings.

Now add a handsome detective, Greg King who has also fallen in love with Jill Gardner and even though their relationship has become more serious he still tries to keep a strict line of separation between his personal and professional life. It isn't Jill's fault that her curiosity can sometimes blur those lines for him, but it is fun to read. I love watching the love grow between these two and unlike other romances this couple actually takes things slow. I like to think that Greg and Jill can represent a couple that could be found in reality. This realistic love story is one of the reasons I am attached to the series. The story isn't about them as

Lynn Cahoon is back with **If the Shoe Kills** (*A Tourist Trap Mystery #3*) with Jill, Aunt Jackie, Greg the hot detective and love interest, and the gang at South Cove Merchant's association.

This time when they try and do the right thing, all sorts of mischief and happenings as they prepare for the Christmas season; from small town dirty politics, murder, a not so pleasant mayor, a work program which turns deadly, an ex-wife, Santa, and a new store owner, Marie Jones of The Glass Slipper.

Set in South Cove, California, Jill runs the Coffee, Books, and More, and heads up the merchant association. A lot of small town business owners who like to have their nose in everyone's business, from the antiques shop, book shop, the winery, the B&B, the shoe shop, and the café.

This season, the mayor kind of pushes her to support a work program (interns) as a way to help out delinquents and store owners during the holiday season. (*not a bright idea if they are into stealing or killing*), or perhaps have ideas getting boozed up at Darla's winery.

The worst part is the guy, Ted who heads up the welfare to work program, Work Today. Of course he quickly creates plenty of enemies and winds up dead. It is Thanksgiving time in South Cove, California. The business community is participating in a work program where interns will help in their shops. Many of them are not happy about this because they are afraid that the interns will be trouble makers and delinquents. And most of them do not like the man in charge, Ted. He is unfriendly and obnoxious and only worries about himself. Someone disliked him enough to kill him.

Jill Gardner owns a coffee shop and bookstore in town and she is also the business liaison with the city. She is unfortunate enough to be the one who finds Ted's body. Although she did not like Ted, she cannot keep herself from investigating the murder. Her boyfriend, Greg, who is a detective, wants her to stay out of it and

leave the investigating to him. But that is not something that Jill can do, so with the help of her friends, she sets out to solve the mystery.

Jill is also planning on hosting a big Thanksgiving dinner for her family and friends and she is stressing out about it. She is also stressing out because Greg's ex-girlfriend is back in town and trying to get him back.
