Really great for getting a really complete overview of what astrology is, how it works, and how to understand your chart but loses points for a lot of "yikes" moments including but not restricted to:

- personality descriptions based upon gender stereotypes (men's aggressive traits are theirs, but women's refer to what type of man they look for)
- outdated views on population & environment
- that awkward section where the author talked about the astrological contributions of ancient civilizations while simultaneously referring to them as primitive barbarians, nearly blatantly stating that it's amazing such stupid people could do something so smart
- that very awkward section where the author attributes all the "us" vs "them" evil in the entire world to radical Islam (and only it - all other religious/political issues are apparently fine)

I have a slightly older edition, so I don't know if updated versions are a little less sprinkled with moments that make you go YIKES. However, this is the best and most complete book on astrology, its history, and each sign + planet that I've found and it really is the only astrology book you'll ever need (except for the times you've got to do your own research if you want a less problematic description).

Speaking of which, I'm currently using Kelis' cookbook, which I will be reviewing. I decided to look her up. I was fascinated to find that she had her Sun, Moon, Mercury, Venus, and Jupiter in Leo. Like holy shit is that intense. I would not get along with her at all... and I'm shocked that Nas, my fellow Virgo, tolerated her as long as he did.

I've also had fun looking up Eminem (workaholic according to astrology) and Lil Wayne (who had a very sexual chart - no wonder he has 4 baby mamas!).

As for me, I discovered I'm a true Virgo Sun (no cusp) in the second decanate, with a Taurus Moon, so I'm quite earthy. I also have a Virgo Venus, so the part about a Virgo woman's amorous nature sounded exactly like me. It was interesting to read about my chart pattern - "the basket." I have all my planets in the same few houses (6-9) except Taurus Moon in the 2nd house, which forms my "handle."

It's a great resource, I'm sure it'll come in handy when my kid gets older and I'm trying to understand him better. Basically covers all the planets, signs, and houses, although the nodes aren't really touched on. Lots of info about your Sun, Moon & Ascendant, though.

This isn't the only astrology book you'll ever need, but it's still pretty good. You really can't beat "Parker's Astrology" by Julia and Derek Parker. This is a good alternate, though. I have to admit I read the digital book and reference books are usually better to read as paper books.

One complaint I had of this Kindle book was the way that it was created. Images just don't work well in Kindle books and the designer decided to put a scan of the first page in each chapter at the beginning of each chapter. That's probably fine if you're reading on a computer but harder to read on an iPad. I'd hate to try and read it on my iPhone and I have to tell you I read a lot of Kindle books and ePubs on my iPhone with no problem. They don't have scanned pages in them.

I would only recommend this book as a paper book, but it has a lot of good information.
