It's getting a bit tedious, to be honest. I wonder if this pattern will be repeated in the rest of the series.

Walk in the Darkness is not as well constructed as the other Stanton books I've read so far. It felt disjointed; as a sex crimes detective in the San Diego Police Department, Stanton's investigation into the abduction and disappearance of 3 teenage girls doesn't move forward, losing all his time because he has to fight a lawsuit and undergo an Internal Affairs investigation. As the reader, we already know who the perpetrator is, but Stanton is still in the dark, and when finally the pieces fall together at the end of the book, it was a total rush-job. It lacked resolution. It lacked the answers to many of my questions.
