Survival was a solid 4 star read. The book opens with Skye and her twin brother Oliver doing everything they could to escape their mother and poor lives. One night Skye is brought by one of Oliver's friends (Curtis) to a cage fight, and after Curtis assuring Skye her brother will be fine, Oliver is injured and later dies of his injuries. Survival is the story of how Skye needs to pick up the pieces of her life. She starts a relationship with Curtis, but having his own issues, leaves Skye with little words, but a parting gift from Oliver. Realizing that it was a book about boxing, I approached it with no small amount of trepidation. I'm not a fan of men hitting each other for sport, and as a nurse, I've never understood the attraction. Having

said that, from the moment I started reading, I didn't want to stop. I could see the beginning of an incredibly powerful story, and I knew I had to follow it wherever it went.

Having read it many times since then, I can say without hesitation that it is utterly unforgettable; a soul-stirring, often heart-wrenching journey of one woman's struggle to survive when all seems lost - irretrievably lost. As difficult as it can be to travel this road with Skye Jones, it is well worth it. Told from her point of view, it's as if you are walking beside her, experiencing it all.

"Twins. You're born together, you grow together, you learn together. You laugh together, you cry together ... you fight together. And then what?"

Skye and Oliver Jones were born moments apart. Inseparable, they encouraged and supported each other when their comfortable childhood slipped away, replaced by traumatic teen years ~ a family torn apart.
