A good prequel that can be read either before or after the first few books in the series. This gives a great background on Henry, where he came from and the circumstances of his childhood, through the light of his adoptive fathers discovering both him and each other. Sam and Vaughn had one explosive tryst and then Vaughn never looked back, but now Sam finds himself in the paranormal world when a young shifter ends

up at his back door. The two are thrust back into each others lives as they seek to save several kidnapped young paranormals.

This was an engaging book that did a great job both showing the romance between Sam and Vaughn and dealing with the tense mystery of who kidnapped the kids. The only problem is it further muddled the idea of mates in this series. In the main series, Henry says his fathers are not true mates. However, Vaughn states that Sam is his true mate. Yet when the two first met Vaughn had no idea they were mates and he doesn't understand why this changed years later. So this series is no closer to explaining how one knows their mate or what signifies being a true mate.

Giving hints of answers but leaving the main mystery for the series, this prequel is a good read either to start the series or supplement your enjoyment!

There are some unanswered questions in this story. Yes, this is a prequel, I get that. Vaughn and Sam went to the same high school (though in different years) and have been gravitating towards each other off and on for years. They are thrown together when a little boy named Ollie shows up at Sam's house in the middle of a storm asking Sam to call Alpha Jerrick for help whether Sam wants to speak to Vaughn or not. Once Vaughn arrives and realizes what is going on, the pack finds and rescues six child shifters / magical beings (Ollie, Ben, Henry, Natasha, Emily, and Jack) and Sam and Vaughn step up and take them in.

This story is a prequel to the series but can be read as a standalone or in any order of the books released so far (All or Nothing, Nothing Ventured, or Double or Nothing – can't speak for any released after these though).

I loved this story and seeing the history of some of the characters mentioned in the books so far as well as their need and love for family and pack.
