She's left alone in a foreign country. At her lowest, she's befriended by the Perez-Cruz's, a wealthy family that owns a winery. Zenna meets Etan, the eldest son, and sparks fly. Only problem is their pasts stand in the way of their future. Etan is the winemaker and communicates best when he's discussing wine. Zenna can't think straight when she's around him. She also possesses a special gift, enabling her to see the past and future. That gift puts her in unforeseen danger and Etan will do anything to protect her.

The setting of the story, a winery in Chile, makes for an interesting backdrop. The Perez-Cruz family is one that anyone would love to be a part of and Zenna is a lucky girl to be taken in by them. You feel the caring and warmth of the parents, the brotherly love of Luca and the strong bond between Zenna and Etan, even though they are unaware at times.

The book is a romance but I enjoyed the bits of "paranormal". Everyone seemed to have a gift in the Perez-Cruz family. Zenna blends right in. As in all romances, there are many obstacles for the couple to overcome and you wonder if it will ever happen. Etan was a little too hot and cold with Zenna for my liking. It went on for a little too long. That's the only small criticism I have of the book. Otherwise, I loved reading about how
