If you're new to Mpreg/Shifter sub-genre, this book isn't a bad start.

Okay, it isn't amazing literature, but unlike a lot Mpreg stories I just started to read, I DO find it (so far) more tolerable than Kirk/Spock stories. Now I'm going to be a picky copy editor right now. A person knowledgeable in 1950s' grammar and such should have gone through this with a fine-tooth comb... See it? The idiom I just used? That took away my ability to suspend my disbelief and at many points spoiled the story being told. Though a good writer will probably let several slip through, a good editor wouldn't have.
