He liked it a lot more than he let on and they shared a kiss. But Gibson is a Dom right? So he runs from a situation that makes him feel bad and would make him seem weak.

Months later Sam is attacked after hours at a bar she manages. Already having vacation planned, she heads out early to hide and lick her wounds at forgetting all her self defense classes. She's frustrated and needs to vent her anger, but when she tried The Ranch, she was turned away due to her state of mind. Restoring her grandmother's house is her vacation plans.

Gibson sees the state Sam is in when she comes to The Ranch, but she safe words when he tries to follow her. He goes to his brother and sister-in-law (who had their book already) to find her. Following her to her grandmother's house he pushes her to let him stay, but on one condition: he is her sub.

Gibson truly does have a fear of being perceived as weak. His father was abusive both physically and mentally. So when Sam dominates him, he goes back to his father yelling things at him. Ultimately he can't get over this one big hurtle and Sam won't let their relationship be a dirty little secret.

Samantha also had a hard life hopping from one foster family after another. Having been attacked as a teenager, she got help and training to protect herself. Now she is finished with her Dominant training and is pretty good at being a Dom men want. It is never sexual, only giving them what they need and the pride she feels in accomplishing that. Backing out to Gibson isn't what she will ever be able to do and live with herself. She is nobody's secret and she wants it all.

I am not a Domme person, but this was a heart breaking romance between people with tough lives overcoming what society has done to them along with labeled them. Getting over out pasts is never easy and in a short book, this is what it all is about and realizing who we really are meant to be.

Time goes by when they finally see each other again. Gibson shows up with mutual friends at the bar Sam works at. He still tried to avoid her despite the need he feels when he is near her. Sam feels the same way. When Sam gets attacked, she is shaken by the event, and runs off for some solitude. Gibson finds out and goes after her. He knows the last thing she needs is to be alone, so he is determined to stay by her side until he is sure she is okay. What ends up happening is an arrangement. He can stay if he will be hers for one week, where he will submit to her.

This was the first book I have read where the dominant in this bdsm relationship is a woman. I wasn't sure how I would feel about it, but I'm glad to say that I really enjoyed it. Sam was a likable character and she did really great for herself despite her horrible upbringing in foster care. I also really liked Gibson and he was a great character despite also having a not so great childhood. However, it did affect him in not wanting to be a submissive. I loved how he cared about Sam and that he would do something that made him uncomfortable and unsure just to make sure she was okay. His feelings for her ran deep and it showed, except for when he was didn't want to accept how he was. I liked the dynamic and the chemistry between them. It was all kinds of hot, and not once did Gibson seem emasculated by being submissive.

I knew this one story was going to hit home before I picked it up just from watching Sam and Gibson interact in the previous *Loving on the Edge* novels. Even so, I came with an open mind and ready to see where Roni would take us with these two. I knew I was going to connect with Sam. What I didn't realize is just how much I would connect with Gibson. In fact, that connection pretty much blew me away. I've loved all of this series, but I have to say this one has become my absolute favorite.

Sam is like so very many dommes I've known. We tend to be very loving and caring but with a core of steel and goo at the center. We can be quite the bitchy sadists. At the same time, we are very much women with all the emotions that go with it. Some of us learn to repress some of those emotions and perhaps in that repression our very need to control is born. Sometimes that need to dominate and control is born from being left no control and the victim of life and circumstance when we were young. In Sam's case, she was orphaned at eight when her grandmother passed. She spent the rest of her childhood being shuffled from one foster home to another always feeling unwanted and passed up. She's experienced her share of emotional trauma, but life fashioned her a survivor. At the core that's just what she is, a survivor taking the reigns of her future in hand. Sam is no longer willing to play second fiddle, someone's secret, or be untrue to who she is, even if it means walking away from the only man she's ever loved.

Gibson... lord how to explain Gibson? That's like trying to describe everything that makes myself tick. Do you have a lifetime to listen? I think I mentioned that I really connected with this character, I don't know if that is the half of it. You see I'm what I like to call a dominant switch. In most circumstances, I'm all over being dominant but put me with that ONE right man where the chemistry is just right and I can topple like a house of cards. I so totally got his need to be in control and to hide any sign of weakness. I got exactly what it meant to power through the pain. But put him with Sam and all he WANTS is to submit and worship at her feet. Unfortunately, getting past learned reactions isn't always an easy fix. Just because you want something doesn't always mean you can make it happen. So things are looking pretty unworkable to Gib. Sometimes, though, it takes figuring out just how important someone else is in your life to decide to make the change no matter what it takes. I really felt for Gib and I have to admit I think fell just a bit in love with him. Damned glad I can have as many fictional boyfriends as I want. And I have to tell you I think Gibson just went to the top of the list.

By the time I got to the end of the book, I was doing fist pumps for Sam and Gibson for working through their issues and realizing the love and life they can have together. Break Me Down is my first read from Roni Loren. It's part of the Loving on the Edge series, and I have to admit to feeling as though I was missing something. Sam and Gibson had quite the history, but I don't feel like it was fleshed out enough in this installment. I wonder if there's more to their story in Gibson's step-brother's story, which is an earlier book in this series.

I really liked Sam and Gibson. Sam had a tough time growing up in foster care, but she worked hard to move on make a decent life for herself. It's not until a disastrous event causes Sam's past and present to collide that things take a turn for the worse. Gibson was determined to be something he wasn't, and it's not until Sam's incident (and ultimatum,) that he lets his true self out. I'm not usually a fan of ultimatums, but I have to admit that it worked well here. It was clear Sam's came from a place of desperation, and I think so did Gibson's accepting it. She was offering something that allowed him to unleash who he really was, and he was desperate to keep her safe. Her ultimatum gave him both of those things; it really showed us a lot about each character.

book review: 4 domme stars!!!

A book that literally caught me deliciously off guard! I never thought that I would enjoy a book with this subject so much. And I'm telling this not because I have something against female domination but, since it's the first one I read with a domme, I was kind of held back a bit. But it totally did worth it reading it....

When I first read the blurb, I was instantly intrigued because it was something different from what I'm used to reading. The fact that the Dom was the woman and the Submissive was the man, kind of hit me full force on my curiosity and it presented me with a chance to explore this other dimension of a D/s relationship while enjoying, of course, a wonderful love story.

“Hard to be friends with someone you want in your bed.”

The introduction to this aspect of BDSM is quite smooth. The first chapter takes you into the first meeting of Gibson and Sam after that moment in the past when Gib denied to be her sub. It's a moment that is "normal" and gives nothing away about what's next. And the **what's next** is plain *indescribable*.

Sex with him in whatever form would probably be like winning the orgasm lottery.

The combination of the love that these two share with the BDSM is just..... **WWHHOOAA!!!** Even when the domination of Sam over Gibson is *pure, harsh, demanding, hot* domination, you still can detect the love that Sam's hiding under her **Domme** role when they play. And since I was been referred to their *play time*, I have **1 huge thing** to say: **HOLY DAMN!!!** *Steamy* doesn't even begin to cover it because it's in a whole different level which you can reach only if you **actually** read the book.

"You want to beat me, Sam?" he said, his voice rising.

"Is that what you really need? You want to take all that anger boiling inside you and rip me to shreds? Then fucking do it. Put me on my knees and do it."

And even if I hadn't had the chance before to encounter Roni Loren's writing, I really see that she has a way with words so her stories to become irresistible. And in this book she had me from the beginning because she took an ordinary M/F love story and added to it some unusual – at least, for me – aspects and situations that, in under usual circumstances, could be awkward and kind of weird. But *no, no, no!* Not even close! With these, she made it a story that can't forget because it stays on your mind either you want it or not.

I went into Break Me Down blindly. I've heard of Roni Loren's work but I have never read her until now. I love a good smutty read but I don't often read a BDSM books, not because there is anything wrong with them, but they aren't always my thing. This novella surprised me though. I've never read a book about a female domme, so I was completely intrigued by the aspect of the story. What I immediately liked with this book was that even though it was sexy and sensual, it was not just about the sex. There was a back story between the two main characters. Samantha and Gibson were friends and both were part of the BDSM lifestyle. The two had an obvious attraction and chemistry between them but they had yet to explore their feelings.

Samantha was beautiful, head strong, and she wasn't afraid to let anyone know about her desires as a domme. Gibson was a such a complex character. He was a perfect balance of sweet, cocky, and caring. He

was a very headstrong businessman and he was used to being in charge. Yet, he had submissive desires that left conflicted and anxious. Gibson wanted to be with Sam but what she wanted from him was his complete submission. He desperately wanted her but he didn't believe that he would be able to give her what she desired.

Both character's had issues from the pasts that they were still battling with. I loved how the story delved into both their past and present issues. Gibson had true inner turmoil and it was written in such a way that I could not help but care for him. I enjoyed the fact they we had the chance to hear both characters inner thoughts and concerns. I liked both characters but it did take me a few chapters before I warmed up to Samantha. It bothered me that she wasn't as empathetic to Gibson's issues as he was to hers. We women love the uber-alpha males who dominate in the bedroom, so that seems to be what most erotica authors write about. But, a dominant female and a submissive male is a truly unique relationship and completely fascinating. Leave it to Roni Loren to write about this and to do it well.

Gibson has always fancied himself a dom, but isn't ready to admit to anyone that he has fantasies about being dominated by a woman. Not even Sam - the woman he can't get out of his head.

Roni Loren made this story so REAL. All the thoughts that Gibson had - all his hangups about being dominated and losing control - they were all exactly what I would imagine a virile man would go through when faced with the choice of becoming a domme's sub. He wants the woman so badly, but doesn't want to give up his macho manly role in the relationship. I totally get that.

Sam is struggling from the opposite side of the fence. She wants the man, but doesn't think she can change who she is in order to be with him. He either has to accept her as she is in the bedroom, or they can't be together, and that kills her. MAJOR props to Sam for staying true to herself - that can't have been easy.

The fact that Gibson is willing to give the lifestyle a chance demonstrates how much he is willing to do in order to have Sam in his life. That is unbelievably sexy. I loved that the switch was hard for Gib. It was not a smooth transition. If it had been too easy, I wouldn't have enjoyed the story as much.

Any Roni Loren story that has Pike in it is a 5-star story for me. Pike's and Foster's appearance and banter with their friend Gibson was my favorite part of this book. They are all so close - their friendship is awesome.

I can't wait for more from this series. It's definitely one of my favorites.

There is nothing I love more than a Roni Loren read. However, this one just did not do it for me the way all her other books do. It came down to one character (and my reading preferences): Samantha. I just am not huge into Domme stories, and while sometimes when my favorite authors write them they work, I just didn't click with Sam's character.

Gibson, however, I adored as a character. What a great guy! I think there is no such thing as a Roni Loren man that isn't the definition of awesome. One other fab thing about *Break Me Down* is the drop-ins from some of the other characters from the series - which is always a real treat.

Didn't really know what to expect and confess to being tentative going into this latest installment of the Loving on Edge series. You see it is a man struggling with his submissive nature and a woman who refuses to hide who she is ever again. They had a moment and then disaster struck. Oh, and there's more...they have dark pasts.

This is a novella between books eight and nine and tackles two minor characters from earlier in the series, Gibson and Sam. It's probably a good idea to read the series in order, but I think there is enough in the novella that a reader would do fine getting it out of order.

The story opens with Sam's best friend, Tessa, and her husband, Kade, stopping by the bar and bringing along Kade's brother, Gibson. Sam and Gibson have a past. He helped her train as a Domme and things were going well until she discovered in one of their play sessions that her training Dom got off on being her sub. He ran from her and has ignored her since. Samantha is attracted to Gibson and still wants him, but she will not compromise her own nature to be with him.

Gibson got a shock when he enjoyed submitting to Sam, but it also brought out lots of old fears that he worked so hard to escape from. He can't let himself be seen as weak or vulnerable as much as he likes Sam. So he walked away, but nothing has felt right since. And then when she is attacked and is shaken up, he can't keep away. She confronts him and challenges him to give them one week on her terms. He agrees. And they both are pushed right to the edge.

The story is a novella so it starts with a crisis that draws the two back together and it works through some deep stuff quickly to get to the sticking point. Now that said, I don't mean to imply that it raced through things and never delved deep. This story had depth and heart. Gibson faces two demons that stop him up short. There is the perception of society against male submissiveness and then the fears of being controlled instilled in him because he grew up an abused child. Sam grew up in the foster system that passed her around frequently and she had no control and a lot of anger before she also learned that she could be prey so easily. She just wants someone to see who she really is and pick her for once.

This pair are a sadist and a masochist and they do engage in this, but I would say the BDSM is moderate at most. There is spanking, caning, rimming, anal play, exhibitionism, and bondage.

Now, I feel like I should discuss the fact that this was a Domme/sub story. Not my general fare when I choose a BDSM read. Mostly I avoid them and for years I would have said it was because I didn't like stories of women dominating men. Honestly, it's probably a little of that, but mostly it was because I'd read ones where it felt like the woman was dominating out of anger and hate rather than it actually being her nature. To me that was abuse and I didn't want to read that stuff, but then I learned that there were actually a few authors out there who could write a decent and even good Dominant Woman/submissive man relationship. There is respect, there is fun, lust of course, and there is trust and love. The woman is commanding, but the man is not emasculated. Roni Loren is one of those few precious writers for me. She writes a beautiful, poignant, yet hotter than blazes story.

So, yes, another solid win for me and a groan of disappointment that I need to sit back and wait for the next book in the series. If you enjoy BDSM that has developed characters and storyline, get going on this series.

This reads like the original inspiration to this travesty, Natural Law.

At least the prose in this version doesn't make one's eyes bleed.

Nonetheless, it's a bad tale. Why are so many femdom stories predicated upon the idea of breaking a man? That's pejorative to male submission. So a real man doesn't naturally, happily submit? It must be coerced?

And from whence did the fallacious idea of dominance being about breaking people come? Should Doms/Dommes be turned on by people who aren't in touch with themselves and accepting of their preferences, by people who find submission to be reductionist?

This book isn't worth the diatribe. It pales and fails in comparison to books like Power Play that features a male sub who has no qualms submitting; a book that doesn't sell one on this dangerous idea of "romantically breaking" a person.

Ps: I get what this purports to be about, breaking through barriers. But it's not.
