This book may surely lay claim to being the best hymn book (words and music) in the English language; and the perfect companion (in both theology, language and music) to the British 1662 Book of Common Prayer. No watering down / political correction of lyrics here.

I was both cheered yet unsurprised to observe that Baroness Thatcher of Kesteven had chosen the 'traditional' lyrics of **The English Hymnal** for two of the hymns sung at her ceremonial funeral at St Paul's cathedral (London) today: "*He who would valiant be*" (402, tune Monks Gate) and "*Love Divine all loves excelling*" (437, tune Moriah). I've known "*Love Divine...*" to be sung at very many weddings; only today did I realise that to my mind the sentiment of the lyrics do actually seem to fit better to a funeral service!

Here indeed is life as it is lived and experienced to the full. Rejoice and sing.
