I became such a big fan of K.A. after reading the Avoiding Series and couldn't wait to read something new and different from her. Following Me delivered what I was hoping by bringing me something completely and utterly different from Ms. Linde.

I do not want to say too much in my review. The synopsis does not give too much away and I think it's important going into the story without knowing too much. For this book I feel being "clueless" will benefit the reader more so than knowing the story and why Devon is running away from her life in St. Louis.

Devon wants to get away from everything and anyone in St. Louis. She leaves to visit her best friend in Chicago and does not tell her boyfriend or her parents where she is. She just NEEDS to getaway and think while visiting her friend Hadley and her boyfriend Garrett. While in Chicago Devon discovers Hadley's little secret and Devon's problems are pushed aside not being dealt with until Devon meets Brennan. All four have problems that will surface and burst open in Following Me creating drama, drama, drama.

The book is told through the eyes of Devon in present time with flashback scenes of the past. As you read you will get a glimpse of what happened to Devon but what I thought what happened judging by the past totally surprised me by what the truth actually was. I was totally fooled. When Devon finally revealed the truth I was like "WHAT?!?!?!?" I just couldn't believe it.

I really liked all the characters in Following Me, Brennan was my absolute favorite!! I would have loved the

story to be more involved around him. He still is a mystery to me still. I also really liked the character of Garrett, Hadley's boyfriend. I know some readers may not like him after reading it but I did. I still think he is a great guy who was just dealing with stress and problems of his own.

Linde holds on to Devon's secret, only giving us crumbs here and there. I honestly had no clue what was until the big reveal.

This is one of K.A. Lind's lowest rated books. I think this happened because the book plays out a lot more like a Kubrick film and less like a typical romance novel. Having said that, I thought it was quite good.

There are four lives that are all connected in this book. The main story is about Devon or "Dev". Devon comes from a family where country music is what they do. Her parents are legendary song writers. Devon has no interest in being a lyricist but she can not deny that she writes songs constantly to express her feelings. Devon is a college student who hops on a bus to Chicago and leaves everything behind in St. Louis. She is going to visit Hadley, her former room mate and Hadley's new boyfriend Garrett.

Devon arrives in Chicago and discovers that Hadley is not who she was just six short months ago. Her life has taken a few major turns and Devon is worried. But Devon doesn't have it in her to be supportive. She is on the run and feels like someone is following her all of the time. She looks around every corner and becomes paranoid that someone is there.

Brennan is the bartender at the local bar in Hadley's neighborhood. He is a bartender by day, college grad and singer by night. Brennan has carefully constructed walls around himself to keep everyone out. He has suffered a great deal and he is not interested in getting close to anyone.

Reid is Devon's boyfriend. For some reason she has lied to him and told him that she was in Paris for the summer. She is not returning his texts, calls or e-mails. Devon tells Hadley that she and Reid are over. She hasn't told Reid that they are over though.

Devon and Brennan start to get close and the closer he gets the more he sees. Devon is hiding something huge.

She has extreme nightmares and wakes up in a cold sweat. Garrett begins offering his support to Devon. He can't help but hear Devon's screams in the night.

Brennan lets Devon in despite trying desperately not to.

"There's that smile, that beautiful smile. I want to keep making you smile, but I can't if you walk out of this place. We pulled each other out of the water once, Devon. I can't bear to see you sink any deeper. Please, please stay with me. Just stay with me," he pleaded.- Brennan

Devon's secrets begin to unravel and her past finds her in the Windy City.

But the way Devon deals with it is not what you would expect.

Seriously Devon! Devon must choose to deal with her past and embrace her possible future, or return to the hell that awaits her.

I really like K.A. Linde's writing style. I felt like this was just a different type of book for her. Perhaps those who didn't like it were simply looking for something else. This was more of a psychological thriller than romance. There is romance in it, but there was a lot more to it than that. I didn't like the mystery behind Devon's swift departure from St. Louis. I don't think it would have detracted from the book to bring out the "problem" earlier on. As it was written, you were left guessing and it became a little frustrating. At one point I wondered if she was simply mentally ill and the issues were delusions rather than reality.

Overall I am giving this 3.5 rounding up to 4 stars. I think it could have been better if the author had focused more on Brennan and Devon and revealed more sooner. I liked this book and I wanted to love it. I got really mad at the end with how the main characters dealt with everything. Though it is a departure for this author's writing style it was still good. 4 Stars.

This review is probably the hardest to write. It nearly kills me to do so and for a few reasons that I won't mention- though I should. I absolutely love K.A. Linde's writing and love her stories, but this...JUST. DID. NOT. WORK.

I'm just in utter shock that she wrote this. Most know I'm a huge fan of her work, but this doesn't even feel like her work or her words- and no, that is not taking a dig at her writing. Not one bit. When I read K.A. Linde, I expect a few things:

Intensity

Emotion

Chemistry

Character development

Passion

I got **none** with that, which is why I cannot believe this is her book! I can't even say I'm mad, more along the lines of **upset** simply because I know what she is capable of and this is only a fraction of it! I waited a few days to write this review and I'm still upset over it all. That's how much I love her writing and knows what she can do. And this isn't it.

Devon has come to realization that her current life isn't what it seems- or she wants. It took an unexpected turn for the worse and she's decided she needs to get out as quick as she can. In her haste to leave, she fabricates stories to those around her and jumps on the next train to Chicago to see her friend, Hadley. When Devon asks Hadley if she could stay with her while visiting, Hadley agrees immediately. Hadley knows something is up, but doesn't push her good friend.

Once in Chicago, Devon can't help but feel as though someone is lurking all around. She is plagued by nightmares and in a constant state of paranoia. But when a moment of opportunity presents itself to Devon, she uses it to her advantage, not caring who she's effecting by it. And by doing so, a whirlwind of events follow her.

Devon is the most closed off, high strung character I have ever read! She needs to take a Xanax, or a Valium- possibly together and add a strong drink in there too. I get that she's on the run and living in fear, but Holy Moses! She's built up a fifty foot wide wall that's a thousand feet high made of steel. She's a very unlikeable heroine unfortunately. No one, and I mean **no one** can penetrate it. Not Hadley or even Brennan, Devon's new friend. That's a problem too since more than half of the book is with her saying she's 'fine' so very little character development or chemistry between any of the characters is done. I felt no connection or chemistry between her and Brennan (or any of the characters, really) even though Devon kind of has feelings for him.

But then again how could I feel anything when she's wound and locked so tight?!!

The intrigue and curiosity in the beginning of why she left began to dwindle away and turn to anger and frustration. Why, you ask? Because we were given **nothing**, not even an iota of why she left or why she has these haunting dreams for at least sixty percent of the book. Not even a hint! **Nothing! Zilch! NADA!** I think that was what she was going for...not really sure? It was dragged out far too long in my opinion and I think that if we were given snippets of her past then it could of worked. But we weren't. It started to grate on my nerves because I started building up this huge, massive twist/climax of the book and expecting it to be great...

And then I read why she had the dreams....

And when I finally found out why she ran....

My heart dropped into my stomach. NOT because it was a great twist, but because....REALLY?! I'm sorry, but with that kind of build up I expected more. I can understand why she ran, it's unfortunate what Devon had to deal with, but it wasn't enough to 'WOW' me at that stage of the game.

After that point I wanted to give up, honestly. I had just spent so much time reading, something like sixty percent of the book to find the answer and it was kind of a let down. Ok, a *big* let down. Once the secrets are revealed- and it's not to who'd you expect either, Brennan and Devon have this insta love, full blown relationship which in my eyes comes out of left field. There had been some "flirting" between them (if that's what you can call it?) but nothing really between them prior because Devon wouldn't allow it. UGH! SO damn frustrating! So, another twenty percent or so goes by and Devon is still holding back from Brennan. STILL! And the only reason why she confesses is because she was backed against a wall. I honestly don't think she would've ever said a word had she not been in the predicament she was in.

Can you feel my frustration NOW?! Can you?! And don't even get me started on how she treated her "best friend" Hadley! There really wasn't much connection between either. I'm not sure why, but it bothered me so much what Devon did to her. Probably because I would never do that and can't imagine a best friend doing it? Or that I don't think Hadley would've said no to begin with? I don't know. And to top it off, Hadley is a pretty serious drug user which Devon hardly steps up to help. That was another thing that I had issues with too, but I think I've said enough.

The only time that I felt even a smidgen of emotion or chemistry was toward the end, but it was very small. I have to commend K.A. Linde for stepping out of the box and trying something new. It's different and unlike anything she's written as of yet. With that said, I'm hoping that this is just one of those books that everyone loves but me. Really, I do. This was just so vague and so not her and it just kills me. I think that's what she was going for and it had a lot potential, but in the end it just did not work.

Just because this didn't work for me, doesn't mean it won't for you. I still say to read on and give it a chance! We're not going to like every book. It's life, but give it a chance at least.

I've been a fan of Linde's writing before she even published. Her Avoiding Series blew me away. Of course I had to drink Mylanta for a week, but I loved it. FOLLOWING ME was different. Way different than Avoiding. There is drama and even a bit of romance. And there are multiple people involved, but to me...it was about Devon and less angsty than Avoiding.

Honestly, I didn't connect with Devon all that much. She's very guarded. Of course, there is a reason for it. She's running from her life. I'll admit, the mystery surrounding Devon's reason for running, felt a bit drawn out to me. I think I would have liked a few more hints here and there. And really, I was expecting something more dramatic. Not that the reason wasn't serious, but there was a lot of build up. I also had some issues with her friendship with Hadley. I won't go into it, but I felt Hadley's issues were downplayed. I know it may seem like I don't like Devon, but in the end I did. I think she mismanaged some things and I did have some issues with the choices she made. However, I did like her with Brennan. Seeing her with him, won me over.

Brennan was my favorite part of the book. I tend to gravitate towards male characters and Brennan is the kind of guy I love. He's a bit mysterious, sweet, and certainly sexy. Let me just start with how much I love K.A. Linde's writing in the Avoiding series. When I heard that she has a stand alone in the works, I was jumping with excitement. But all that enthusiasm went downhill pretty fast.
