It encourages students to feel positively about school and what they learn. It was an easy read and the vocabulary was appropriate. At school they started their day with the Pledge of Allegiance, and that is a good message to get across. It also sends a message of peace by how well Brother and Sister bear get along. I think it's fitting for a classroom full of anxious children.
