The description of this book led me to believe this book would have many of the qualities that I enjoy in romance--sweetness, angst, and hot sex. I did like the book, but I didn't love it. I never could grasp what it was about Mal and Leif that made them have feelings for each other. Yes, they were both nice guys, but other than their proximity, I couldn't see what made them want to be with each other. I guess what I'm trying to say is that this book had a great premise. Mal is rebuilding his life; Leif is struggling to take care of his father. There is ample fodder there for an emotional, sweet story, but I did not connect with the characters at all. Perhaps some of that was due to the length of the book. I think that if it had been longer and the author had time to really flesh out certain areas of the plot, it wouldn't have felt so rushed to me.

In a word: Maybe read the thing. I had a bit of a hard time getting into this one, even though I did like Mal and Leif. I'm not sure what it was, but I just couldn't make myself connect to the story or the romance. Mal is a former Olympic swimmer who has just returned to his tiny hometown (the titular Sylvan); Leif is construction worker who moved to Sylvan a few years earlier. They meet by chance and things get off to a bit of a rocky start. They're both instantly attracted to each other, but they seem to keep accidentally getting on each other's nerves. Also Mal has a bit of a party-boy history, and Leif is holding out for a true romance, so they're a bit mismatched at first. It really seems to take a while for any romance to get off the ground, which is weird because this is a novella, and a lot of that time is taken up by some annoying back-and-forth.

It is great when Mal and Leif finally get their act together and start going out, but the lead up to that fell a bit flat for me. There's some other stuff in the story about Mal trying to figure out where his life is going now that he's no longer an Olympic swimmer, and dealing with the grief from losing his grandmother; and Leif is trying to figure out how to have his own life while also caring for his elderly father who has Alzheimer's. This wasn't a bad story, and I thought the ending was really nice, but most of it felt mostly 'meh' for me.
