I actually gave this book a 3.7 on the 5 point scale.

This is book 5 of the Worth Series, which is one of the problems with the story. I've not read the previous books and so when "old" plots are mentioned, I was lost. The author also spends a good deal of time setting up future plots with the other Beck brothers. Eighteen characters were introduced in the first 16 pages. It got confusing quick.

I do like the concept of the story: the idea that not all divorces are final, and that young love can mature and last. However, I found the story line a bit "preachy," saying the same thing over and over, and not even in different words. The ending appears a bit rushed. The story dragged until the ending, and then "bam" it was over. There were also lots of curse words.

There are some grammatical errors that should be addressed:

Be aware of split infinitives such as "to truly speak her mind"

Need to use possessive pronouns before gerunds as in "my becoming" or "his losing"
"Different than" is never correct. "Different from" is the correct form.
I also wondered if the NHL was not a registered trademark.
