I feel like the overall message in this volume was envy, jealousy, and comparison. All those characteristics intertwined. First, I was surprised with the amount of bullying with Renee and cheerleading. Unfortunately, I think it's realistic to the high school era so it's important and necessary to address it in novels. I found this a very, very important message because unless someone makes that decision for themselves, it won't last or be as authentic or it could result in a large amount of resentment. I really did enjoy this novel. At times Paula felt like a little too much to handle but at the same time she also brought out some of Christy's worst qualities and effectively showed her what she had to work on within

herself. I also felt that Christy's letter to her future husband was a unique but very good idea.

### 3. A Heart Full of Hope

In this novel, Christy has finally reached the age of sixteen the age which she has been waiting for to begin dating. This novel was PERFECT and may in fact have been my favourite in the trio. I think it was so realistic to real life and important for those out in the dating world (younger teens and older). In fact, some of the relationship issues Christy encountered when she's sixteen, I still am faced with in my mid twenties.

Definitely am LOVING this series and wish that I had it to read ten years ago when I was struggling with the teenage years. I think all of the content is appropriate for youth growing up because all of these situations they will also encounter. For adult readers, I think this series is also a good read because it will take you down memory lane to different times you may have experienced. Also, it's an entertaining read and I think there will always be something to learn from it.
