Thirty-nine stories from the Bible that we're all relatively familiar with from Sunday school, but they're not watered-down, child versions of them. I purchased this book as a Christmas gift, however I couldn't help but read it first. I love the concept. Many Christians who were raised in church take for granted that everyone knows the basic stories learned in Sunday School. This is obviously not the case. This book is a great solution. It's not written for children, so it doesn't insult the sensibilities of intelligent adults; yet it isn't as overwhelming as attempting to glean all the essential stories from Scripture in a short amount of time.

Harp summarizes the stories well, without adding extra-Biblical extrapolation. He's not preaching sermons, he's retelling the stories. While for the most part this is an ideal approach, I feel some contextual information would be well placed at times. New believers, for example, might not understand the concept of "blessing" crucial to the story of Jacob and Esau. I realize it would be a very fine line between defining and adding commentary, but the story itself could be incomprehensible to some without background information. I do think his retellings are interesting enough to turn the reader to the original texts (the references for which Harp includes with each story).

Additionally, I was reminded of some story elements that I had forgotten after years of teaching the toned-down versions to children. So while I would recommend this book to any new Christian, I would also recommend it to any believer who wants to look with fresh eyes at the narrative of Scripture.
