The story contains several storylines and emotion without drama. Overall, I liked it more than most I read in the genre.

[As a side note to the author: humans do not squawk (not sure why female characters from this genre are suddenly squawking). As regards narration: across this series, the characters often "center" themselves. While the characters may complete this action, they are all too different to use the same wording to describe it. Many who are "centering" themselves in the stories would not have such vocabulary. Catching their breaths? Taking a moment? Counting to ten? Mentally checking out for a second? The correct term would depend upon context, but the cowboy and the shop owner do not both call it "centering" themselves unless they had recently been to yoga together or something similar.]
