I received this ARC via NetGalley in exchange for an honest review. This novella was part of the Scandalous Summer Nights boxed set. This novella is book 1 in The Highland Knights series.

The gist: Claire and Rob have been married for three years, but they've been estranged the last year. He's a soldier and he's been off fighting for England against Napoleon. Claire is determined to reunite with her husband, so she sets off to meet up with him at Waterloo. They are reunited, but rebuilding their marriage isn't quite as easy as either of them hope it will be.

I enjoyed this story immensely!!! Claire and Rob are both GREAT characters! Claire is an English Earl's daughter, but she's not as prim and proper as her station in life would deem prudent. Rob is a Scottish highlander who was awarded a Baronetcy after saving the life a Duke. He was not born into the aristocracy and he's definitely more comfortable with his fellow highlander soldiers than the English gentry. Rob is very much a masculine man who doesn't show or talk about his feelings or emotions. When tragedy struck the couple, Rob didn't react the way Claire thought he should, so she lashed out at him. Rob, being a man and very literal, takes her at her word and walks away from her even though it nearly killed him to do so. When she reappears on the battlefield, he's afraid that she'll crush him again.

When they FINALLY stop and talk about all that had happened to push them apart, my gut was clenching and my heart was breaking for them. That's a feat for any author, as I'm not particularly prone to emotional connections with characters or stories and I don't think it's EVER happened in such a short story. It's not generally in my nature to give a novella more than 3 stars due the shortness of the story, but I HAVE to give this one four because of the quality. I was quickly IN LOVE with both the hero and heroine. The story moved quickly due to its length, but it was chock full of goodness. There are almost no words to express how much I love this woman's writing. I am always left in awe of Jennifer Haymore and even more-so now that I have read this novella that is filled with so much emotion I feel like I have been through a war.

Lady Claire Campbell told her husband that she hated him and she never wanted to see him again. Heeding his wife's revelation, he is sent to the Continent with the Highland Guard to fight Napoleon's army. Herself in pain, Claire practically tears out Robert's heart and stomps on it when she bids him to leave.

Major Sir Robert Campbell had been a simple Scotsman before he saved Wellington himself and was given a title. He then married Claire, who before this was out of his league socially until given the title. He thought they got on well until a tragedy happens that causes a rift the pair have no idea how to deal with. Rob has the army that calls him and he must obey, his honor insists upon it. When he is injured in battle he awakens on the bloody field to a sight he never thought he would never envision again.

Claire knew that she should never have shouted the words she did to her husband before he went off to a battle he could potentially never return from. The guilt weighs so on her that she takes her sister and a maid on a quest to France, to the battlefield, to find Rob and apologize for her words. When Rob awakens and begins to recover from a terrible blow to his head, he cannot believe Claire has come to him and he can't fathom her intentions. After all that passed between them in the last year, he is wary of Claire since her words seemed so bitter and final.

Upon returning to England, Rob has been given orders by his superiors that have him and his men stumped. Instead of reporting to the War Office, they have been given instructions to appear at the Home Office where they are presented with an offer he and the men find hard to refuse, but it will forever change their lives. Once alone with Claire, Rob and she flip back into the comfort of their missing intimacy only to repeat the pain of the year before.

All Claire wanted was for Rob to care about what she went through, to mourn for the loss that so affected her. When she once again tells him to leave her alone and he does as asked, she feels all is lost. Rob must come to terms with his emotions and those of his wife, who he left so emotionally distraught, he doesn't know how or if they will recover.

Yes, *A HIGHLANDER'S HEART* by Jennifer Haymore is a novella, so eloquent and so complete, it tugs at your very heartstrings and doesn't let go. This story runs the gamut of emotions before being at ease in the end. Both characters are so wounded by a tragedy that no one should ever face. Claire's words hurt her husband more than she could ever understand and when she finally does, getting Rob to actually believe her apology is a journey in itself. Rob's total misunderstanding of Claire's pain and the way they both deal with it, makes this a compelling read, one that I most highly recommend. Jennifer Haymore is one of my favorite authors and I want more from this very talented author.

We only get a little glimpse of his emotional hurt from before the war, but there isn't much time to examine how the war (and Waterloo) change him. This is unfortunate because the book opens with him waking up in the bloody aftermath of the battle.

The problem of novellas, in my opinion, is that there simply isn't much room to delve into a complex problem. I know only a few authors who can pull that off.

The problem Claire and Rob have to overcome is a heartbreak one. Yet, it isn't mentioned until the last third of the book. It's clear from the beginning that there's an estrangement between them, but I wish the author had revealed the reason earlier so that Claire and Rob had more time to work it out and thus, created a better character development. The way it was executed, however, felt rushed and ultimately shallow.

Furthermore, this novella sets up a new series surrounding a secret group of ex-soldiers who call themselves the Highland Knights which took even more space away from Claire and Rob's story. Pity, really. Claire and Rob's story had so much potential.

A Highlander's Heart by Jennifer Haymore is a 2014 publication.

The war separates a couple who departed under strained circumstances, with harsh words being spoken. But now as the battles rage, Claire begins to fear Rob will be killed and her horrible words will be the last ones they ever speak to one another.

Finally a letter arrives from Rob explaining to her where he will be, and so Claire decides she must make peace with her husband and sets out to meet up with him.

Against the horrible battle of Waterloo, Claire finds Rob alive, but not well. As she begins to nurse him and others back to health, he receives new orders. So, with the now or never moment, Claire begins laying the ground work to save her marriage. But, will it be enough?

I enjoyed this short story that highlights the importance of communication and cautions against making presumptions about how others are really feeling and letting angry words hang in the air without making peace.

The cause of the rift between the couple is not hard to guess at but once the couple begins to open up with each other explaining their misconceptions and misunderstandings , the resentments and hurts begin to give way to healing.

I also think there are times when despite being hurt and angry and feeling more than justified about having those feelings, that making the first move to heal the rift is the right thing to do. If Claire had not swallowed her grief and hurt and let go of her pride, their marriage may have died with no chance at recapturing what they once had.

This brief story is quite emotional and deals with some tough subjects such as depictions of war and loss, but the issues within the marriage were deep and difficult, however, the healing brings out how deeply these two love each other and makes sexy time that much more meaningful. I wish more historical romance authors were not so afraid of making their stories more substantial. Emotions and sentimentality are not things to be afraid of. Light historical romps are great, but stories like these seem too few and far between. 4.5 stars rounded to 5
