I was fortunate enough to receive a copy of Burn Out for part of a book tour hosted by Girls Heart Books Tours, this will in no way effect my opinion on the book!

Surprisingly it was the cover that drew me into this book when I saw it needed more hosts (update: truly sorry for being a terrible one and missing my day!). I say surprisingly because I really do not like the colour pink and try my hardest to steer clear from it. However it works great in this cover and really pulled me in.

After reading the synopsis I was sold. I had questions and needed to know how and why a known murderer was forced to return to their old life.

I absolutely love that this book is not what it seems.

Burn Out introduces us to Delia during her last session with her therapist, and her last night in the mental asylum she has been locked away in for the last ten years.

A little different to what I expected from the synopsis but it was a nice surprise.

Delia leaves her prison, and returns to the only place she knows. Home. Sunny Shores.

Upon arriving she meets this drop dead gorgeous guy, Liam, who doesn't seem to care who she is or what she is supposed to have done. (The excerpt below is part of the scene where they first meet)

Liam welcomes her into his home after a day of somewhat getting to know each other, and the sparks between the continue to fly.

But this isn't what the story is about. Nope.

Its main focus is about Delia as she adjusts to this new life, the freedom, the lack of medication and trust from the town around her. But luckily she lands herself a job at the Surf shop and starts to piece herself back together.

Including some memories from that night long ago, memories she thought she wanted to keep buried with guilt. But is that so? Is there more she has forgotten about that night.

The chemistry between Liam and Delia continues throughout and I really like the growth of their not-quite relationship.

However they do have a tricky patch pretty early on about Liam's friend with benefits girl he has round and whilst he and Delia weren't exactly an item it was a bit of an odd thing to do and didn't really make sense, but this was pretty much the only flaw the book had for me.

But was it the only flaw Liam had? Maybe, hehe.

Maybe not.

As Delia comes closer to solving the puzzle that left her in a psych ward for ten years, things get tough and she has to face some demons from her past.

There are way to many unanswered questions in this one to give it a 3 star. It started out really strong and I liked Liam, even though you find out he was hired to get to know her. But, here are some of the glaring ones? Why does the Dr. at the facility hate her as much as she does? Did Delia's mother sleep with her husband? Just and evil bitch? What?... And lets not forget that the Dr. works at a state facility, there are programs to help someone who has literally NO practical experience with dealing with the outside world. Use them! Liam has a whole strained relationship with his parents... why? What happened? They keep him from Delia? How, he's a grown ass man! Why was Mike killed? A warning? If it was a warning... or they were getting to close, why not kill all of them? What actually happened when her family died? You never actually find out. Her near death experience has her father telling her that her future is with Liam and she has to go back, but the author says that Liam and Delia don't get a happy ending, because it wouldn't be real. Really? What about the Lion King moment you just gave Delia? Does that smack as real? Here we have the main character Delia who is coming out of rehab center for being a pyromaniac and setting her house on fire as a child, which ended tragically. After spending half her life within the walls of the center she is finally being released. She should be happy right? While she is happy to be rid of that place she doesn't know exactly how she is going to survive on her own. Being in a facility like that for half your life and not being taught how to take care of yourself or learn anything of real value can be scary for anyone. Especially for someone who the whole town has shunned you and you can't even go into a food establishment to get a quick meal before you starve to death. Well Delia, is much stronger than you might give her credit for. She doesn't take shit, she doesn't whine and complain, she does what she has to do. Growing up the way she did, it is inevitable for her to be any other way. Yea she has her moments where she doesn't think she will make it, but that doesn't stop her

Her first night out of the center she meets a handsomely, attractive young man by the name of Liam. She actually tends to run into him on more than one occasion and he is setting her hormones on constant overdrive every time she thinks of his sexy smile and dripping with sex body. The storyline of the Burn Out is fresh and new and that is what I liked most about it. While things seem to be going as well as can be expected for Delia, suddenly we find out that the events that took place-involving Delia and that one faithful night might not have entirely played out the way she remembered. There is someone else that was there that knows more to the story, but is willing to kill again to keep it a hidden secret. With this tidbit of information Delia starts digging and she has Liam and her boss Mike to help her. However, it doesn't take long after they starting planning for things to take a turn for the worse.

Sometimes there are more than two sides to every story. That is the message I take from this whole story. Not everything you hear on the news, radio, and by word of mouth is always the correct story. Thinking like that can ruin people's lives for no good reason.

I will tell you there are no cliffhangers in this story for those of you that hate cliffhangers, but it will leave you maybe wanting more, or questioning as to why it had to end the way it did. It will leave some of you content and satisfied, and for others (like myself) it will feel like a cliff hanger or that something is missing and you need more information. Still a really great story and I would definitely recommend it.
