As with Book 1, 'Scattered Seeds' is an excellent 4-star value that continues our journey through the Changed World series!

Another exciting and well-written book by Alice Sabo. The on-going 'adventures' of Nick and the rest of the High Meadow (and beyond) survivors continues to be an emotional roller-coaster filled with tension and hope. I have to admit at first I wasn't very thrilled to see the number of chapters (66 spread over about 220 pages). In my experience, that kind of 'cutting' leads to what I call 'airport novel pacing', of which I am not a fan (think covers with spies, hot Russian women and swastikas). But the author skillfully balanced the more abrupt spacing (compared to Book 1) with fast-pacing and exciting twists and turns.

I will note though for future readers that both this and Book 1 read more like chapters in a larger book. To be blunt: you're going to have to expect to invest yourself in all the books in this series to get the full effect. Still, I find that they are more than fair-priced for such a well-spent afternoon's worth of reading! Enjoy!!

Scattered Seeds is a pretty dark book - the virus has mutated yet again, and this year the government has not sent any vaccine. Nick & Wisp head out to find a "brother" to Wisp, who works in a government lab making vaccine. When they arrive, they find the majority of the facility littered with dead bodies. The vaccine was released before the scientists felt it was ready - and with lethal consequences. They do find Kyle, a brother to Wisp. They gather up the survivors and bring them back to High Meadow.

Even with the violence & death, there is a lot of hope. High Meadow continues to grow, as more & more survivors make their way there. New sources of food are found, which is important because the "train food" that the government stocked in the train stations is no longer there - a tipping point has been reached where there are no longer enough people to run the trains, the factories, or the delivery system.
