Footnote: 1) I've been keeping an Excel chart of all the main & regular personnel, plus the level plan organization of Event Headquarters. At the end of this book it is stated that L72 was the deepest, most secret storage level, but in previous books we read that both Levels 73 & 74 were destroyed and rebuilt and L75 was newly opened for new artifacts. So that means L72 was not the deepest and obviously not very secret. Especially since an earlier book said that the nuclear reactor was on L120.
