"Essential VIm and Vi editor skills" is a lot more descriptive than "VIm and Vi Tips". The books is nothing more than the description of the basic editing commands. Based on the name, I've expected something more (some real non-obvious tips), but unfortunately, it is not there.

Very poor. Although it's called 'tips', it's really just a fairly basic tutorial. Perhaps useful for beginners but others unlikely to pick up anything new; even in the final third, 'Tricks', there's little more advanced than using visual mode. Just when I got my hopes up that there might be more, the final sixth of the book is actually about ed instead. If I had had to pay for this I'd be extremely disappointed.

Not to mention a number of mistakes. Quite a few typos (e.g., 'rouge' instead of 'rogue'), plus some technical errors (ASCII is 128-bit, not 256-bit). Worse still, some of the errors relate directly to the subject matter of the book itself (e.g., it claims that there are two kinds of visual mode when in fact there are three).
