The Antediluvian, another breed of immortals try to rid the world of Lilith's kind with their warped sense of justice, they do no harm to humans, in fact, they encourage humans in all pursuits, be it good or evil but, choose to wipe the Dark Immortals from the face of the earth.

The characters are all very down to earth and in your face with both their strengths and their faults, I think the author has captured the essences of what life is like on the seedier side. So many novels show their immortals with flaws but never really show the human side of them, most of the immortals that are written about were once human so it is great to see a group of immortals with such beautifully descriptive flaws. As I said the story does drag you in and I had finished the book before I really wanted it to end. I do hope that there is a follow-up book as it appears the author has this in mind with how the book ended.

The thing that bugged me about the book was the obvious errors that should have been picked up by the editor. There were instances throughout the book that does really tarnish what is otherwise a great story. One other thing that I found frustrating and it is probably only a personal thing that will not bother others, but I disliked how the Antediluvians were referred throughout. They were referred to in three different ways "Antediluvian, AD and Anti" I personally would have preferred to see the author stick to one reference for them instead of swapping from one to the other.

Having said all that, if you can look past the errors this is a story that is well worth getting your hands on.

I struggled with this book. I found the opening disjointed and lacking of context for the reader. I felt as I thrown in with no explanation and lots of "slang" used by the lead character and her group without any orientation for the reader. Examples of the "slang" was the term AD being used and I had no idea what that meant and then when it was spelled out, it was never sufficiently explained. In other words the story lacked context from the very beginning for me. Also, there was inconsistency of terms and at first I wasn't sure if the characters were talking/thinking about the same thing. I know humans are by nature inconsistent in their thinking but when trying to convey a story an author needs to make sure to not loose the reader. That alone makes me want to give the book a 2.5 stars. However the premise of the story is great and the overall story was actually well written. I know that sounds like a contradiction, but it was the beginning that was the downfall for me. It took me to get to about 30% into the book before I truly felt I had things worked out and in taking so long I could never fully get into the book. I have the impression that the author has a wonderful and complex world for this story in his mind, but it did not translate as well to the pages. If a little more context would have been given up front I think I could have easily given this book 4 stars. Therefore I split the difference and decided to give the book 3 stars.
