106 pgs. Not having read the earlier books in the series, I'm at a disadvantage in reviewing this. This is a spy series where a nine year old boy is recruited by the GPF (Global Protection Force) to battle the world's most dangerous villains while searching for his missing older brother (who also works for them, but he doesn't know yet). This installment takes place in the arctic when Jack is trying to save some scientists. It gets kind of rough when he's caught in someone's office and gets punched out then drugged. That seems a bit harsh for a children's book. It's all about global warming as a very in your face message throughout. There are lots of cool gadgets that boys will like and a sno-speed machine. I would pass on this one. Not recommended for ES. It is a 5.4 reading level but seems older.
