With the TARDIS out of action it left the Doctor at a complete disadvantage, especially with the translation circuit no longer working, thankfully English is spoken in Sweden!

There's plenty of fun scenes with The Doctor trying to convince the authorities that he's associated with UNIT, with novice time traveler Fitz trying to bluff his way through makes it even more comedic.

The Sci-Fi element of the story really kicks in during the second part of the book. Revealing the mystery made the story drag slightly, but it still made for a satisfying fun read.
