Our story begins with Charlotte at home with her brother, Ricky. Of course, her Stepfather is away leaving them to have some quality time. Then, Lisabelle makes an appearance with an announcement in hand regarding the death of Princess Lanca's father and her upcoming coronation. It seems that everyone is invited including the dark powers. Lisabelle and Charlotte head out to join up with Sip and her parents. Of course they are attacked on the journey and it becomes increasingly difficult to know who to trust. When they arrive at the castle, Princess Lanca meets them and takes them into her confidence. Ms. Edwards writes a scene that was so disturbing to the point I had to think whether or not it was truly necessary.

Charlotte meets up with Keller for brief periods at a time and it seems that his family is none too pleased with their relationship.
