A set of stories from the VA world. Warning I mention spoilers from both the Vampire academy and bloodlines series here so be warned.

The turn of the flame : A story about a young Tasha Ozera and how she became the strong, independent revolutionary we see in the VA series (before her totally uncalled for character assassination), how her brother and his wife (Christian's parents) turned strigoi and were killed. An interesting story it paints the picture of a young woman who never felt like she quite "fit" or could be what everyone excepted her to be and by the time she decides to throw caution to the wind and do the things she was always too afraid to it's because she has lost so much that she really has nothing left to loose. It's a poignant "what could have been" chapter in her life and the missed opportunities and hesitation when it came to her perusing a relationship with an old-flame whom she truly loved obviously weighed heavy on her and have ramifications (albeit stupid one's in my opinion) in the VA series.

My main complaint is what I saw in the other two series and it's Mead's obsession with having ALL the characters have "shared" backstories, it's a cheap and super-lame plot device and also makes her world seem incredibly small and superficial; like the moroi-dhampir are supposed to be an entire worldwide secret society of vampires with a whole human MIB-type government spook situation existing to hide them from humans and yet EVERYONE goes to school with everyone, everyone's parents knew each other through contrived coincidences and they all end up running the moroi world...from Pennsylvania....

A prime example of this is (view spoiler) and we see this again in the Tasha story.

I always assumed that Tasha met Dimitri when she was already a karate-chopping badass but it turns out she met him at court when her family died because he just so HAPPENED to be there visiting from Russia the day before she left for good and also Rose's mother who is established to be a Scottish woman whose charge travels extensively somehow has time to personally lead the hunt. Heck why didn't they just make is so that Rhea Dragomir was best pals with Christians mom and Lissa's Dad and Abe are poker buddies with Sydney the alchemists dad the EVERYONE could have some sort of shared backstory. I genuinely liked the story because Tasha was my favourite before her nonsensical character derailment but we didn't need the inclusion of Dimitri and a Hathaway to make it interesting.

The meeting : The story of the night Lissa and Rose were caught and taken back to the academy from Dimitris POV : This one was just so unbelievably stupid and cringy. Like Dimitri a fully-fledged adult guardian luting after a teenaged brat he just met. I think I finally see what Rose and Dimitri have in common now though; they both love talking about how awesome Rose is. The BEST part has to be when the guardians are all wondering aloud how two teenaged girls; one weak and pathetic the other dumb as soup managed to evade them for so long, suggesting they may have had help. Dimitri gets one look at Rose, just a look, she hasn't done anything yet and is basically "She is defiantly working alone. I can see that now. OMG she is the goddess of ass-kicking reborn, it's amazing she hasn't evaded a MILLION guardians. I can tell all of this from her....stance...." no joke, seriously...uuuuggghhh....also Dimitri is just as boring in his own head as he is in the rest of these books

Hello my name is Rose Hathaway: Rose is coerced by Lissa (who wants the prize as a gift for her boyfriend) into competing in the St Vladamirs annual scavenger hunt arranged by the students which involves stealing contraband. It involves Rose and Co running around the school gathering items and trying to evade teachers and co-competitors alike, naturally they win. Told from Roses' point of view so naturally we can expect to be TOLD a few things

- a) How awesome Rose is
- b) Dimitri is just the hottest guy like EVER. OMG even all the teachers and the school principal are throwing themselves at him
- c) Did Rose mention she's a Guardian? They have like super-speshul guardian training that makes them so much better at everything than everyone else, they can "scour" rooms for clues, use their heightened "guardian spidey senses" to evade traps and I dunno somersault through windows parkour style

Honestly it was fun I still find the Dimitri-Rose relationship to be unbelievably creepy. It's not the age difference that bothers me, it's that he was her TEACHER when they first consummated their relationship. It actually makes my skin crawl to think about it, guy should be arrested or at the very least blackballed from every being around minors again.
