We continue Sam and Bob's adventures in the new volume of the End Street Series. They are still trying to place all of the children that they rescued from the sirens, but there is one child that doesn't respond to them. Mikhail spends some time with her whilst Bob and Sam are looking at schools for Mal, only for the sirens to make a reappearance. He fights them and tries to protect the child from another being that has entered the bathroom. The other being ends up being Jin, who is actually there to protect Eliza who turns out to be a Dragon princess. In the second story, we meet Nick, who is half-human and half Christmas Elf. He doesn't think highly of himself due to the derogatory remarks that have constantly come his way from his family. He meets Zeph, an angel.

In both of these stories, the fated mates bond snaps into place immediately for one, whilst the other takes at least a couple of minutes longer. Sam and Bob still have the same, amusing and hot relationship. With each book, the story gets deeper and the characters more intricate. Definitely recommended if you want a light, humorous, paranormal, M/M story!

In the aftermath of rescuing the children, Sam and Bob are now parents of little vampire girl Mal and as such they have to find a suitable school for her and they still have another girl under their care, one who has refused to speak out or give any information regarding who she is, until Mikhail gets her to tell him her name. After being attacked by sirens who come through a portal in Sam's bathroom, Eliza, the little girl, manages to call upon her guard, dragon shifter Jin, who helps them get rid of the sirens and ends up being Mikhail's mate.

Sam, Bob and Mikhail join Jin and Eliza to deliver her safely back to her father, the Dragon king, and hopefully find out who is behind her kidnapping.

I loved this book! Sam and Bob are as awesome as ever and I just adore their banter and chemistry. And I already loved Mikhail, so it was lovely to see him find such an amazing mate in Jin, who was just perfect for him.

I really liked that we get to know a bit more about what Sam really is and have him still trying to deny it, even if he's starting to accept that he's not fully human.

This two story collection is great fun. Sam is human--really he is! Why do people keep asking him what he is? Sam is fairly paranormal prejudiced human, but when he opens up a detective agency in the same location as his uncle, he's inundated with them. I chuckled at the constant running joke of paranormals suggesting that Sam wasn't quite human and Sam resolutely ignoring all evidence to the contrary. There's a good amount of sexy times along with all the mind-reading (Bob) and other hi-jinx. The first book in the duo involves the case of Eliza, the last of the kidnapped children from the first book, who turns out to be a dragon. When her guard shows up, he and Mikhail the vampire-siren hybrid from previous books discover themselves to be fated mates. Now all need to solve the case of who betrayed Princess Eliza. There are lots of cool dragon facts and an interesting mating tradition. Mikhail panics a bit at the thought of having to live in the dragon world if he accepts the mating but finds he can't really deny his true mate. There is a great twist in

this one too! The second book/case involves a necromancer who is threatening Sam and Bob's adopted daughter's school. In this book the featured couple are Zeph, an angel, and Nick who is a half-elf who is part of Santa's family. Nick has very low self esteem as a result of being snubbed and bullied by his family, who he doesn't fit in with at all. Zeph's protective alpha stance and love gives Nick a reason to value himself. Zeph makes a great rescuing figure, all confident, powerful, and tender. As usual there are a bevy of colorful side characters and plenty of mini mysteries and plot wrinkles. The series continues with it's trademark humor and sweet (but spicy) romance. I'm glad that the authors reissued the stories after the originals went out of print and the box set is a great deal. The two stories follow directly after one another and are really one but involve different MC's. One of the things I like best about this series is the wide range of paranormals featured. Where else can you find vampires, werewolves, ghosts, gargoyles, dragons, the Fae, angels, demons, sirens, and oh yes-the elves of Santa's family all in one series? Heck, even in a single story? It makes for some highly entertaining reading that makes you laugh along the way.

In The Case of the Dragon's Dilemma, we get to see Mikhail-a half vampire, half siren-get his chance at a mate when Jin comes along. There's dark things afoot amongst the dragons, and Mikhail, Jin, Sam and Bob head out to figure out what's going on. There's the usual witty banter between the characters, along with a bit of mystery and action as they work together to go after a necromancer who's trying to cause havoc.

Yes, there's a bit of insta-love going on with Mikhail and Jin, but for me it's perfectly acceptable in the guise of soul mates (one of my favorites in paranormal stories). The two of them together are sexy and hot, but the intimate scenes don't take over the story--the mystery is always central in the End Street stories.

The necromancer story arc continues in The Case of the Sinful Santa. Nick-Santa's nephew-is a bit down, and meets Zephariel while attempting to drown his sorrows at a bar. The meeting between them sets off a spark, and we get another fated mate pair story set among zombies and the continuing necromancer problem.

For me, Nick and Zeph didn't have quite the connection that Mikhail and Jin did, but they did grow on me, especially when facing the angel court toward the end of the story and the scenes following that.

Both stories are fast-paced and quick reads. I liked reading them together in the one volume since the two stories had the connecting element of the necromancer, which made it feel more like one big story. And even though each story gives us a new couple to focus on, we still get Sam and Bob (along with Sam's ever-evolving non-humanness) and their constant love story as well.

This all makes for some fun stories with mystery, action, drama and of course love. End Street Volume 2 was a 4.5-star read for me, and I would highly recommend this book and series to M/M paranormal romance fans, especially those who like a lot of different kinds of paranormals all interacting together in the same story. This book is meant for readers 18+, mostly for the M/M sexual content. I hope Amber Kell and RJ Scott are planning a lot more stories in the series, I'm really loving this crazy mix of creatures and the maybe-kind-of-or-not-so-human Sam!

Mouthy, snarky, strong willed, and perfect for these two. The other little girl who was rescued and no one came to claim, is now the issue as they don't know her name or what species she is. Poor little thing.

Turns out it was Mikhail who managed to at least get her name (Eliza) from her, and then saved her when some sirens came looking to steal her back. That's how Mikhail meets Jin, captain of the Royal Guard, and a dragon. Eliza is a dragon princess and since no magic works on them unless from another dragon, now Mikhail, Sam, and Bob have to help Jin get Eliza home because it looks like one of her kind wants to hurt her. Nothing ever comes easy for this gang! *grins*

Yes, not easy at all. Not only does someone want Princess Eliza removed as heir to the throne, but there are so many political machinations and schemes going on at the dragon's palace, that Sam and Bob don't know which end is up. Plus Mikhail turns out to be Jin's mate, and then there are the concerns over where they would live - not life threatening, certainly, but something to be discussed... you know, after they find the traitor and save the kingdom.

Wow! Once again, these authors had me wondering and trying to guess the outcome, right until the end. I loved Smudge's explanation of how Sam is the least human human alive, but I'm keeping that information to myself... at least until Sam decides to tell the gang. But, oh Sam, why did you ever get into an agreement with a powerful familiar like Smudge without asking what the price would be beforehand? Oh, this is going to be so much fun! Not nearly as much excitement as the next case that just landed in their laps!

The blurb for this case made me laugh out loud, so it's no wonder I was ready to jump right in. The fact that it turns out the necromancer who caused the problems for the dragons has now unleashed a zombie horde at Mal's boarding school - a school filled with young paranormals of all ages - doesn't bode well for Sam and Bob. Now that Mikhail is mated to Jin, the dragon king, he won't be along for their adventures, although I certainly hope to see him again.

Turns out Smudge knows an avenging angel he can call in for favors, which, apparently, is the only way to deal with zombies. (I'm loving Smudge more and more.) Zeph isn't entirely happy to be summoned as he was

just getting kissed by Nick, whom he met in a bar. Having Nick show up at the school throws Zeph for a loop, until he discovers that Nick is Santa's nephew, and unlike the rest of the family, he can sense areas of despair and hopelessness. Voilá, the school and the zombies.

It gets very exciting when Danjal, Zeph's cousin and Hart's mate, do a locator spell on the necromancer, only to have it be bounced back at him, almost killing Dan if it hadn't been for Zeph and Nick. The only way that could have happened is if the necromancer is using celestial magic, for there is nothing more powerful than angels and demons. On a positive note, however, Sam is able to match his first familiar that Smudge brought him to Dan. Remember the price Sam owed for Smudge's help? Well, Sam's home is about to become a halfway house for unmatched familiars. I laughed. A lot.

And again, the authors knocked it out of the park! I adored Nick and Zeph even more for the struggle they endured to be together forever. It was wonderful to see Dan and Hart, and I'm always thrilled with Sam and Bob. Now that I have some idea about what Sam is, watching the evolution of his powers will be quite entertaining!
