I found most of the book forced and rushed, as if the author had it all planned out but didn't fill out the scenes enough. It bounced forward too quickly if this makes any sense at all. Often the author would say one thing, then say the opposite the next paragraph or page (ie: the protagonists disbelief in what is happening one minute, then fully believing the next second). The synopsis captivated me sufficiently that I decided to pick this novel up. 'Fated Loss' isn't a novel that I particularly enjoy but, at the same time, I don't dislike the novel as well. It is more of a 50-50, in my opinion.

The beginning of the novel is really enjoyable. The perfect and mundane life of Rose gets turn upside down on her sixteenth birthday when she remembers what she has forgotten. The aspect in 'Fated Loss' which captivated me the most would be the different life lessons, morals, and values, the characters in the novel learn on their journey to save the dying kingdom. Values range from trust, love, friendship and finally kinship. I have an enjoyable time reading about each character's self-discovery and growth along the way.

As the novel progresses, I feel the plot going downhill as events which occur thereafter feel more forced than needed. I lose interest on a few occasions and even thought of putting the novel down to take a break. In the end, I managed to pull through and read 'Fated Loss' in 2 – 3 sittings.

I didn't particularly warm up to any characters in 'Fated Loss' though I did enjoy reading their growth and development over the course of the novel. However, I was hoping to see more parts of the novel that focuses on the chemistry between Rose and Logan.
