I will note for some Christian readers that struggle with profanity. The author does give his characters profane language. It seems authentic to the characters - they each have their flaws so their speaking style fits. I'm not much for profanity (don't use it) so there were times when I wished the words weren't there but they in no way kept me from enjoying the story. I'd rate the language in the book PG-13/R for the number of uses and some of the violence in the story. Nothing that's going to give you nightmares but it is there and some readers may be turned off by it.
