The series, loosely based on the Jane Austen novels with this one retelling Persuasion, has roughly been following the school year and, here at the end, its bittersweet times since the property has been sold with the new owners planning to bulldoze it and turn it into a mall. The students are excited because they are preparing for spring Prom and since its their last, they want it to be the best. Love is in the air as all the dating couples prepare for life after high school and the far flung directions they will all plan to go. Not for Anne and she gets to agonize as she watches the bold and brash Lucy cling to Rick while he studiously ignores Anne or is painfully polite. It's her own fault since she's the one who broke up with him.

That being said, it is not lacking in merriment and mayhem since Lizzie challenges all the girls in their group to snatch a piece of school history as a souvenir of their time there that was personal to that particular person. And Emma is busy orchestrating the prom down to each meticulous detail keeping them all busy jumping to her orders.

Because of being the last book, this one has a heavier feel to it and its definitely more angsty since the focus is Anne as she says good-bye to her family legacy and is forced to see the result of letting her fears and trying to please her mother lost her Rick. This is definitely a story that took some time to come to a head. It's all told third person from Anne's point of view. Anne is not one of the stronger and sparkling heroines that make it easy. This is the last of a series but I got it when it was free and only read this last book out of six. The teenagers

featured in these stories are taken from Jane Austen's stories but you can probably read this without knowing her stories. I was able to connect the characters as the spellings or the names chosen or who they fall in love with are clues.

I would definitely say that this is a series for Young Adults or older teenagers. We read about the Academy closing down and the plan for a prom and about plans for the future, which include couples planning to live in the same cities as they go to school or to fly to the city their boyfriend/girlfriend will be living in.

This last book is based on Persuasion. Anne had broken up with Rick several years ago after he moved to attend a military academy and mother convinced her that a long distance relationship was just not the thing! Anne suffers from low self esteem and has little, if any backbone. Her mother has not paid attention to the Academy which had been the family's for many generations and so this book centers around taking apart what stays, what goes to be sold and what is trash.

It was interesting to read about what each young lady was going to red-tag as "trash" an item so she could keep that memento. Also a tour was given to help decide what might be saved by the mall going in. The story does give you hints about the history of the Academy and the couples.

This book was OK. I can't say that I would buy it if it had not been free.
