The story is about determining who the malefactor really is, the criminal who has no idea of the crime or the judge who is judging too harshly.

It is a seemingly pointless story of unresolved conflict. It was the first Chekhov I've read and I found that, like Tolstoy and Dostoyevsky, he pulls the reader inside of the characters. The external situation is nearly irrelevant. At just over two pages long, getting readers inside the mind of the characters, one with a simple view of life and one with a complicated one, is impressive.

An interesting story that depicts a conflict between the magistrate and a simple, uneducated man: Denis. One cannot help laughing as Denis cannot even fathom what he is being accused for and the magistrate cannot believe the man's completely stupid answers to be true. Utterly unaware of the consequences of his action, which he justifies by simply saying that everybody does it, he breaks the patience of the magistrate and readers as well.

The story is unresolved; leaving the readers to decide who is the Malefactor: a stupid peasant who could have possibly killed thousands or the Magistrate who is inconsiderate to the lack of knowledge of such men.
