I thought this story was awesome. The same and new characters and new plots and storylines made reading this so much fun! My favorite story was the one where Ultron creates a wife using Wasp's life force but she turned against him. Ultron was like the villain that always manages to escape or come back and his schemes were better than the ones in the Age of Ultron movie.

This is actually exactly what it advertises: a manwha adaptation of *Avengers Origins: Vision #1*; *Avengers* (1963) #57, 67, and #161-162; and material from *Age of Ultron* #10AI. I don't know why, but Ultron actually looks happy to me. I'm not sure that the artwork works for me personally. Ant-man's eyes in the helmet especially make me uneasy. It felt like DBZ was sneaking up on me by the end of it.

I was never a big fan of marvel movies (not including Spider-Man 1&2) but this book was really good. I gave this book 4/5 stars but I'm not really excited to finish the series.

The book opens with an active roster that gives the Vision's background--he was created by Ultron but turned against him. This is like the trailer giving away all the best stuff about the movie, because the first

story is about Ultron creating Vision and Vision siding with humanity.

The stories are amazingly disjointed, but when you read the fine print, it makes sense; Si Yeon Park adapted stories from six different previously published issues, including four from the early days of the Avengers in the sixties.

Back to the active roster...

Reformed former criminals=3

Women=2 (mind you, Natasha is in both groups)

Avengers who don't actually appear in this book (one panel doesn't count!)=2 (yes, Natasha overlaps again)

And for some reason Scarlet Witch is in the book and an Avenger but not in this roster. Come on, she's in the movies!

I also really dislike the Wasp's costume: stinger shapes cupping her breasts and then a series of arrow shapes pointing to her crotch.
