Let's see; a pushover heroine, with low selfesteem, and her misogynistic soon to be abusive lover. The reasons I hated the books, or some of them anyway:

1. Alex, the male protagonist, and lion shifter, takes advantage of his position as chief security officer to take stills of the female protagonist, Bea, from the office surveillance cameras, for his own personal enjoyment. Can you say creepy stalker.
2. When an unknown person threatens to harm Bea, if Alex doesn't give him 10 million dollars, Alex chooses to promote her to a position as his personal employee. There are two things in this. The first is that he does not tell her she is in danger, nor does he provide her with security outside the office. Not acceptable. The second is that she is promoted admittedly ahead of more qualified people (before this she delivered the office mail), and within a month she is engaged to the boss – that is bound to provoke her colleagues. Bad interoffice behavior.
3. When Alex has changed in front of her and run off, Bea discovers his wallet in her car. Now, not only does she not freak out that her boss transformed into a 550 lb predator, she decides to return the wallet – good. Unfortunately the way he goes about it is unfortunate. On three separate occasions she ignores the option of handing it over, first to his personal guard at his home, then to his brother, and finally to himself. Failing to hand it over in person, she instead uses the keycard to let herself into his apartment when he isn't

home, to leave the wallet (boundaries, lady!). Oh, and while she's there she decides to use his shower because "he always smells so nice" (creepy), and finally takes a nap in his bed!

4. Upon finding the crazy girl (too immature to be a woman) in his bed, Alex does not call the cops like a sensible person, instead he feeds and fucks her. And he is so rough/big/whatever that he actually breaks her vagina. According to the doctor he calls in the morning, she has "hairline fractures" in there. Is that even possible? And if so, ouch.

5. In the process of aforementioned wild lovemaking, Alex decides to bite her, which is apparently some kind of permanent mate mark, and makes her his. Now call me old fashioned (actually don't), but I prefer to have more than one conversation with a person before committing for life. Of course, he doesn't actually ask her if she wants it. 8. Upon the rescue, darling Alex and sweet Bea have sex yet again, (despite the hairline fractures – double ouch), this time without a condom, because they have been together for two days, and it's time for them to get married and begin having cubs. Because Alex "isn't getting any younger". Yikes.  
After reading this book, I was left with the feeling, that Alex is going to turn into an abusive asshole once she is leg shackled and preggers. I do not recommend this book, unless you like your heroines weak and incompetent (and somewhat stupid), and your heroes macho, misogynistic and borderline stalkerish.

If you are looking for a light, funny read with lion shifters, and heroines who aren't victims, read Shelley Laurenston instead.
