The historic period is quite interesting. It's during the end of the Carolingian period, when the descendants of Charlemagne fight among themselves for kingdoms while trying to contain Muslim pirates, Viking raiders and other invaders. From that turmoil, the core European states were created – France, Germany and Italy – but their foundation was unstable and bloody conflicts would continue to occur to the current day.
