The plot for this story was okay, though it took about half way through the book to realize how the plot line was going to work (before the 'recruiter' even enters the story).

The writing also seemed a bit overdone. As in if it was Beth's last chance to reach a goal, the prose would go on for two paragraphs about 'it was her last chance. She had to do it. Everything counted on this moment. She could not fail. That was not an option...etc for another two paragraphs.

But when the ASVAB came up and the author didn't get the acronym right (while writing a military based book, no less) it lost a LOT of points (it's the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, not the Armed Services Verification Ability Biography).
