Anyone can enjoy this introductory novelette/short story to the Chet and Bernie short stories.

The story, told from the perspective of Chet, the dog, contains his sometimes lighthearted perspective of what humans do and want in contrast to a dog's instinct. Chet understands quite a bit more human dialogue than a real dog would, but do we really care?

Although written for adult readers, I'd feel comfortable reading the story aloud to 5th or 6th graders, or letting them read it on their own. Once you've read it, maybe you'd recommend even younger.
