Barbarian's Soul is the third in a series, (I don't believe I missed anything in the first two), these novels take place in Rome during Nero's heyday before he went all bats*%t crazy burning Christians as if they were tiki torches in his gardens.

Bran is an Irish barbarian that served as a gladiator during enslavement, he's very sexy (or so we're told). Adria is a Roman orphan (who has sexy violet eyes) that's been living as a thief in the streets and slums. Bada bing bada boom we have insta-crush when these two have a brief glance in a crowded market place.

The story could have had way more meat, the reader is not immersed in early Rome nor are they ever given the chance to fully invest in either of the main characters. The characters are boring and even the sex scenes are yawn worthy. The timeline of the story seemed way off too, whole weeks are missing and this causes the reader to miss time that Bran and Adria should have been verbally sparring or even just getting to know each other. Emotions are glossed over, character history is sketchy, and the whole feeling of the novel seemed rushed.

All in all it was an ok read, not something I'd think twice about other than I promised to write an honest review after my Firstreads win. So here it is & there goes my chances of ever winning again.

3.5-First reads winner. Overall the book told an interesting and detailed story. Th description if the marketplace and the violence was vivid and brought the reader to Rome. I was clear the two main characters, Adria and Bran, were passionate about life and each other. They had clearly defined personalities and made their differences and lust an interesting thing to experience. There were two things I was not fond of in the book, prompting the 3 versus 4 star rating. The first being how whiney the children are, it took me out of the story and made me not care if anything happened to them. The other, and this is just my personal views, was the exposition took to long. Neither character acted on their feelings until almost half way through the book, making it less romantic than anticipated. Generally an enjoyable read.
