The title says "The Everything Guide for Kids Who Love Space." That just about sums it up. This wonderful book is filled with definitions, facts and trivia about ALL things related to outer space. It is a dictionary, mostly, but it also includes a "History of Space Exploration," an "Astronomy Timeline" and a list of books for additional reading for anyone interested in the subject of space.

The main part of the book is divided into four sections: Cosmology, Stars and Galaxies, The Solar System, and Astrobiology and Exoplanets. Each section does a great job of covering the subject matter of that section. You will learn about the origin and evolution of the universe in the Cosmology section. The Stars and Galaxies refers to deep space astronomy. The Solar System is about the Milky Way. Read about the search for alien life in Astrobiology and learn about Exoplanets, which are planets that orbit other stars.

This book is chock full of information. Full-color photos, as well as drawings and diagrams are used to illustrate the information on each page.

I'm not a big fan of outer space, but I enjoyed reading this book. The text is written in an interesting and easy-to-read manner. The abundance of illustrations help break up the material, making all the information easier to digest. This book would make great reading for anyone with an interest in anything related to outer space. Teachers could use it in the classroom as additional source material for units on space.
