The intro includes information on how to build to-scale, how to use CAD modeling to design your creations, and how to be a better free-styler. The projects pictured in the book range in level of difficulty with instructions for the easier, more doable builds and beautiful artistic images of projects that took hundreds of hours and hundreds of thousands of bricks. My favorite scene was from the London Olympics' opening ceremony, complete with a Lego interpretation of Queen Elizabeth and James Bond parachuting into the stadium! I appreciated that there were short histories of most of the buildings, which helped me to know where the real buildings were located and why each one is considered iconic.
