A fun horror read. I liked that it wasn't so focused on being funny that it failed to be funny. Too bad it ends just as it's getting going. (It's more 3.5 than 4 stars, but I prefer to round up.)

Good idea, poor execution. (Pun intended.) There wasn't much humor to this "horror comedy," and although there was gratuitous splatter, the horror build-up was also lacking. Why is there a murderer loose in a weight-loss camp, anyway? Nothing is ever really explained, and the ending is an overly swift wrap-up that doesn't help matters. Somehow the main character emerges triumphant, despite being at the mercy of a homicidal maniac only seconds prior. Not sure how the author jumped from point A to point Z there, and I'd like to see a more logical plot progression. Nice try, but misses the mark.

Killer Abs has a lot of potential, but it also has more than a few problems.

First, it needed someone to proofread it. The sentence structure is awkward, it is poorly punctuated, and sometimes characters are referred to by the name of a different character.

Second, the ending was too rushed. It had barely been established that something strange was going on at the club before the climax happened. Also, a major character was introduced just pages before the end of the book.

I think with a little rewriting and some careful editing, *Killer Abs* would be a pretty good read.
