Reading the cover of this book, you can feel the potential oozing through the words "prepare to enter a new dimension of horror". However, I wouldn't actually describe this book so much as horror as I would "suspense + gore". The start to this book was also quite slow, and I had to force myself to read through some points that felt a bit dragged out, as well as a character that wasn't really a character(?) that I didn't find was at all necessary to the plot.

However, after a certain key event approximately halfway through the book, the story sprouts wheels and picks up the pace immensely, the characters accomplishing worthwhile feats and the plot really rounding out. So, overall, I really enjoyed reading The Floors (or at least the second half), and although I wouldn't recommend it to someone seeking out a horror novel, I would gladly lend it to someone wanting a decent read.

I won this book through a Good-reads give-away contest, and it was my first read by author Lucian Poll.

The positives: I felt that the idea of a "maze" comprised entirely of the "missing" 13th floors from buildings all around the world was a unique concept. Some of the characters displayed traits of survival that were quite plausible, under these conditions. The story also flowed well, making it easy to go from one scene to the next.

The cons: I did not personally find the main character, Dawn, likable. Even when she showed a bit of concern for another, it somehow didn't come across as authentic to me. (I felt that she contradicted herself too much by her actions throughout the course of the novel). Also, there were some scenes that were just a little too confusing (I won't go into spoiler territory and elaborate)--but this just could have been a personal issue I had, which others might not find the same. The ending seemed a bit abrupt and "anti-climactic" after all that we had read before; and again, there were aspects that I just didn't understand in regards to previous scenes.

Overall, i'm going with a rating of 3 stars, because I did like the idea of the novel. However, I felt that certain issues needed a bit more clarification, or that they could have been done away with all together.
