The heroine does fall somewhat blindly for the heroes on very little evidence of them being good guys underneath barbarian exteriors, which should be no surprise to anyone that is a fan of O'Connor's work or the MNW trope. Very little erotica for those seeking a spicy read, even less than what is included in mainstream Romance genre novels, but it is still a M/M/M/F menage setting.
