In this second standalone title in Christine Bell's Skin in the Game series, the story revolves around Ty, a veteran returned to college to get the eye of a football recruiter and Flora, Teaching Assistant.

When Ty and Flora meet on the first day of class, there's an instant lustful connection between them. But Ty has lots of issues from his past and so does Flora. I'd assumed Ty's issues were from his war time experiences, and that is just part of it. Turns out he's got more than one demon in his past.

Ty didn't hide his dark side. He had one goal and didn't need anyone else. His return from the Sand Box was just part of his pain—one he'd never recover from so why try.
