I had this book on my “To Read” list for a while. It caught my eye because of the cover. I can’t tell you how I landed on it, but I suspect it had something to do with the cover.

Finally I read it. I was this II close to dropping the damn thing when I was three chapters in. Why? Because the downside, and I mean MAJOR downside of independently published books, is the piss poor editing. This one has it in spades. Piss poor editing, that is.

Obviously my reviews will never earn me free books, but I heartily volunteer to read (I mean, edit) the sequel to this Volume I, The Undying!

I must share some of the issues, so you see I am not exaggerating:

Envelop is not the same as envelope.

Guttural feeling? I suspect it is not what he meant. Guttural, is throaty or harsh sounding. Do you mean a feeling that comes from the gut (visceral), or the back of someone’s throat? I’m confused! o.O

Many magpies are not a gaggle, they are like crows: a murder, or a tiding, or gulp- But not a gaggle. Gaggle is for geese or noisy people.

Wilhelmina checks out her “pivots” in a mirror. I have NO idea what a pivot is in this case. No idea.

You do not “experience a grandeur moment” but a moment of grandeur, or, a grand moment.

You do not say “between she and her guests”. It’s between her and her guests.

Bath and bathe are two different things.

Illustrious and lustrous are not the same thing.

Neither are desert and dessert.

Then on one page it’s crazy time with the “off of.” Here is the deal: it is redundant, and no longer acceptable. Maybe once it was accepted but here it is: “The compound preposition off of is generally regarded as informal and is best avoided in formal speech and writing.” Another grammar book is quoted as “much inferior”. Need I go on? Just drop the “of” already!

These are just a few of the things that screamed out at me and seriously dampened my enthusiasm, and I am by no means a grammar expert. As I said though, if it is your project, put some love into it, some care. Because if you don’t care, why should I? Once I got past the poor grammar, missing words and bad choice of words, I couldn’t put this book down. Spectacular plot!

Here is why I do give this book 3.5 stars, because, editing aside, this is one of the BEST books I have read in a long time. Great set up of atmosphere and time. Great job with the character. Great story and twists and turns. It reads like a classical Austen girly book on Gothic crack. AWESOME!!!

Wilhelmina is a headstrong young girl, with her first crush on the only person who actually pays attention to

her and listens to her and shares books with her. Then the civil war gains strength, her step mother, like a true and evil step mother sends her off to a “governess”. This book pulls no punches; life is not easy and doesn't get any easier for Mina. The governess is cruel and the animosity between them is instantaneous. Governess Bathory will remind Mina of her powerlessness at every turn, in the most cruel and heartless ways. Then before you know it, the book takes a turn and you realize this is SO much more than a civil war period piece about the trials and tribulations of a Southern Belle. I can't give more up. Not even with spoiler alerts.

Some people have made comments that Mina is weak. I don't really know what they are comparing her to, or what standard they have, or do they read so many books and have no time for the kind of love she feels for Charles Aberdean. The kind that can make you invincible because of the hope attached to it; and when that hope is taken away, that same love can take away the desire to even breathe. Oh yes, there is a difference between breath and breathe, by the way!
