I was disappointed in this slender retelling. It left out all but a few basic motives. We don't learn much, if anything about the elves or "Elders", including why they are even at the North Pole in the first place. Everything at the North Pole is already set up and functioning for the Claus' before they arrive, including the famous toy factory and the list (actually a computer database.) Mrs. Claus has some angst about aging overnight from a young 20-something to a grandmotherly 70-something. Not really a whole lot else going on.

For a version with some actual substance to it, try Kringle by Tony Abbot.
