I saw this on Netgalley and thought it sounded like it could be a really interesting dystopia/post-apocalyptic story. I believe I was right. This first installment takes a few to get into because you're getting the set-up for what's to come throughout the season.

High school student Holden is giving his crush a ride to a party that he would've otherwise not been invited to. He can't believe his luck that her car broke down right after their high school play performance. But on the way, something horrible happens to them both. In the aftermath his crush is having a hard time looking him in eyes, even as they run for their lives from unknown mechanical predators. Stuck on an unknown planet (is it Earth?), at an unknown time (why are there carcasses of buildings in the distance?) with no idea how they got there (or why), how do you prepare? How can you make a plan when you have no idea what you're planning for?

This episode was just enough to get me to want to continue the series, but not quite enough that I could give this any more than 3 stars. Though I do have the feeling that, had I been reading this as one whole season at the same time, it would end up with an overall 4-5 star rating. I will definitely be continuing the series. I for sure want to know what's going on and why these specific people are being "chosen".
