The authors' purpose of this book is to show young girls different lessons about life. The author of each story wants readers to feel that what they are going through is a part of life. If a situation in this book happens to the reader, they know they're not the only one. They show how to handle situations such as a first kiss or a death in the family.

The main theme of this book is to be true to yourself and the people around you. Do what you think is right, and enjoy life. The section "The Pressure's On" is all about peer pressure. It includes stories about real girls who stood up for what they believed in and what was right. In some stories, girls had chosen a friend instead of popularity. In another story, a girl simply said no to cigarettes.

This book is broken into 10 sections that include six to nine stories about the same theme. I believe each story is written in the rhetorical mode known as description. In the first person point of view, the stories describe life-changing events by the girls who actually experienced the events.

Descriptive writing gives the readers the feeling of experiencing an event first-hand. Description is effective for this book because the authors and almost all of the readers are teens. That means that the teenage readers better understand what the author is saying because they are both in the same age group, and they have about the same teenage mindset. Most of the events in these stories will occur to all girls at one point or another.

The first-hand feeling of the book prepares a person better for when it actually happens to them.

For example, the story "Hero" is about a girl who lost her mother and the events leading up to it. The author retold the story as if she wrote the story the day it happened. She wrote the many thoughts that went through her head when she found her mother unconscious. Another story that uses a lot of descriptive writing is "The Party that Lasted a Lifetime." The author wrote about the many thoughts that raced through her head when she went to an older girl's high school party. She went into great detail, and she even described the outfit she was wearing.

I loved this book. It contains many powerful messages in its stories. I have learned a lot about how to handle various situations. The stories I liked the most were the ones about boys. In the section "Crushing Hard," I found the love stories very enjoyable. I also liked that the stories in this book were short. It kept my attention. I did not like the stories about death in the section "Tough Stuff," but it made me appreciate my friends and family much more. I don't think the authors or editors should change anything about the wonderful Chicken Soup for the Soul series!
