Leigh goes back to her boyfriend who proposes. She can't shake what happened on their break, but after some convincing from her family and friends, she gets engaged to DeShawn. Neither Leigh or Jeremy know the other one's name, or that DeShawn will be the common factor in this whole mess. When they are introduced at Leigh's engagement party weeks later, stuff starts to hit the fan.

Will Jeremy be with Leigh? Will Leigh be with DeShawn? Will Jeremy and DeShawn's longtime friendship stand up to what will be revealed?

I picked this book up because I enjoy reading about different cultures. In this case, the book features a hero who is African American as is the heroine. I enjoyed this book mostly because it was like learning a whole new language. The slang and actions of the characters was so different from anything else I've experienced. I found myself starting to judge some of the characters behaviour (the way the hero and his cousin talk to female characters), and made myself suspend judgement, since the language seemed acceptable within the culture.

The story has a traditional HEA. The loose ends are tied up and we are left with a good teaser for the next book which features Quentin.

Quibble: although we're told the heroine has a career and is successful in her own right, we don't ever hear what her job is, how she affords her LA lifestyle. Nowhere in the story does she ever have to work.
