I must say, I'm glad I didn't pay for it because it was a wee bit disappointing. The blurb is insanely misleading, Charlotte isn't in any danger. But Judd helps her brother Wade solve a crime, which is where the 'suspense' comes in. Unfortunately, Sala was a little too free with foreshadowing back in the day. I knew who the villain was, what happened, why they did it, everything - almost from the first bit of foreshadowing. So for most of the book I was just thinking "Oh my god, the answer is RIGHT IN FRONT OF YOU! When are you gonna clue in?!" Which is a terrible way to enjoy a book.

The romance was Sala's usual sweet and and wholesome fare. The characters a bit more bland than her usual. I liked Judd, but had a harder time connecting with Charlotte. Rachel, the baby, was absolutely adorable. And Wade was kinda so-so, he didn't have a lot of personality. But the story wasn't about him, so I guess that doesn't matter. I'm probably giving this book an extra half star for the librarian. Oh wow, she was hilarious.
